

Ontario Hydro Sued For Million

OTTAWA (CP) — A \$1,145,465 damage action has been filed in Ontario Supreme Court here against the Hydro Electric Power Commission of Ontario by four companies who charged Hydro broke an agreement not to interfere with log-driving operations on the Ottawa River.

The companies are the Upper Ottawa Improvement Company, Canadian International Paper Company, E. B. Eddy Company, Ltd., and Gillies Brothers and Co., Ltd. They claim that under an agreement made in 1943, Hydro undertook not to take away the right of timber companies and others to drive logs down the Ottawa River. But subsequent construction of dams at a number of river locations have hampered logging operations, the companies say, and have forced them to spend large sums on piers, docks, slips, permanent camps, tugs, boats, saws and other equipment.

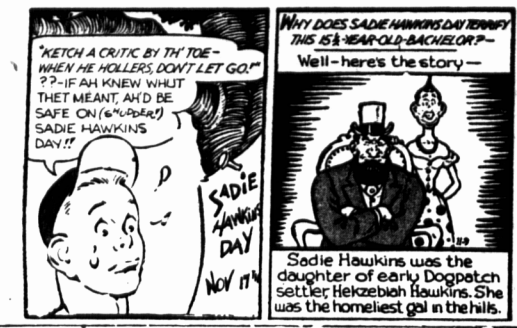

CONTRACT BRIDGE

You are South, both sides vulnerable. The bidding has been:

North East South West
1♠ Pass 1♠ Pass
2♣ Pass 2♣ Pass

What do you now bid with each of the following four hands?

1. ♠AQ94 ♥J7 ♦KJ983 ♣Q6
2. ♠AJ65 ♥98 ♦AJ754 ♣82
3. ♠AJ53 ♥98 ♦AJ72 ♣Q974
4. ♠AK97 ♥Q85 ♦A8743 ♣—

1. Three notrump. North has identified a more or less minimum hand by his last bid, but game should nevertheless be insisted upon. Two opening bids make a game and there is no reason to think this hand is an exception.

2. With the powerful queen of clubs and the other suits each presumably doubly stopped, the play for game is very promising. It is true that North has shown a reluctance to play notrump, after all four suits were bid, but our spades and diamonds are far better stoppers than he suspects. A two notrump rebid would be inadequate.

3. Pass. This time partner's sign-off must be respected. Game is very remote considering there is no fit with either of North's suits, and he presumably does not fit either of ours.

In view of the apparent misfit it will probably take the full 26 high card points to produce three notrump. North can hardly have the 16 high card points needed in the face of his two club bid. Once the decision to play for less than game is made, there is not much point in trying to find a better spot than two clubs.

4. Four clubs. North's failure to bid notrump indicates a distributional situation. He is likely to have a singleton spade or diamond because if his distribution were 5-4-2-2 his last bid would probably have been one notrump.

With our heart singleton and good suit control joined to his unbalanced hand, game in clubs appears likely. The eleven trick contract looks easier to being in than the possible nine trick notrump contract.

4. Four hearts. This is a slam try. A three heart bid would be forcing only to the game level. Despite the two club sign-off, slam is not out of the question. North is not of course obliged to continue the bidding, but with a suitable hand that does not contain much club strength he is at liberty to do so.

Our three suit bids have attempted to picture the actual distribution 5-4-4-0. North therefore knows that club strength is largely wasted, but club weakness with high card strength elsewhere is exactly what is needed.

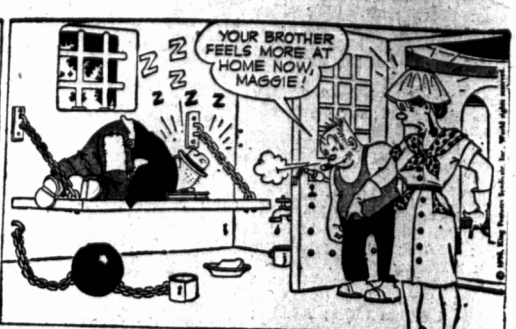
right on following Lightfoot's trail. Of course those two-legged hunters would follow the Dog. It was a trick worth trying.

Chrysler Announces Increase in Prices

DETROIT (CP)—Chrysler Corp. announced Wednesday in the factory retail prices on cars ranging for \$31 to \$302.

The increase will average out to a 4.5 per cent boost where 1956 and 1957 models are comparable.

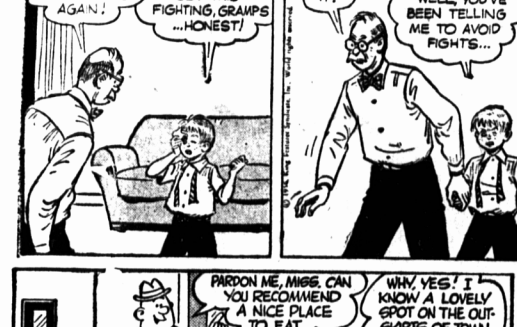
