Teacher's Study Group Meeting At Uigg

A successful Teacher's Study Group meeting was held at Uigg School on May 26 under the supervision of Mr. Willard Brehaut. Miss Thelma MacDonald, teacher of Orwell Cove, acted as chairman. Mr. John K. Martin from the National Film Board, showed two educational films - "Maintaining Discipline in the Classroom" and "There is No Royal Road to Mathematics." Mr. Martin gave a very interesting talk encouraging the teachers to stay with their profession. Topics discussed at the meeting were: 1. What arguments should teachers use in dealing with parents who insist on sending to school at this time of the year children who are under school age? 2. Discuss problems in connection with the grading or promotion of pupils. e. g. - Should pupils

be promoted only at the end of the year if a class has completed study of the authorized reader? etc. 3. Discuss the preservation of school records and materials forwarded to schools from the Department of Education. 4. Discuss problems in connection with the Grade VIII and Entrance Examinations. Should pupils be permitted "to try for experience"? 5. Are we doing our utmost to encourage our pupils to read good literature? 6. General Questions. Teachers present were: Mrs. Enid Ross, Uigg; Mrs. Bessie Martin, Lyndale; Thelma MacDonald, Orwell Cove; Charlotte Hughes and Marie Duffy, Millview; Betty Gillis; Victoria Cross; Jean MacKenzie, Grand View; Velma Gillis, Newton; Marion MacDougall, Newtown Cross; Marion MacDonaid, Bellevue; Joan Nicholson, (student teacher); Rita Hynes, Greenfield; Helen McIsaac, Vernon River; Rose Morrissey, Orwell; Louise Brehaut, Heatherdale. The meeting closed by singing the National Anthem.

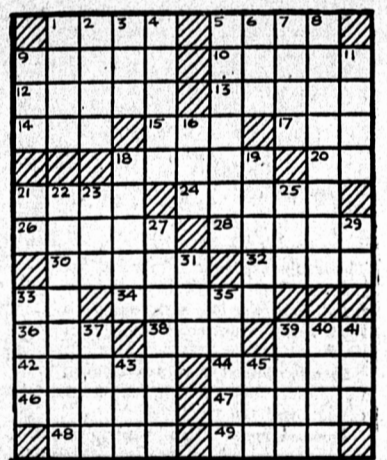

Elizabeth the Second, by the Grace of God, of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Queen, Defender of the Faith.

To all to whom these presents shall come or whom the same may in any wise concern,

GREETING:

A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS it has been deemed expedient for the protection of the citizens generally and especially of those who from time to time make use of the Highways of this Province to set apart a period of time during this calendar year when the safety of the citizens as aforesaid should be given paramount consideration by all inhabitants of Prince Edward Island;

AND WHEREAS it is considered that the month of June in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fifty-two is a suitable period for such purpose;

NOW KNOW YE that we, by and with the advice and consent of our Executive Council for Prince Edward Island, do by this Our Proclamation order and declare that the said month of June in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fifty-two be set apart as

SAFETY MONTH

during which time all persons are constrained to give heed to the safety of all citizens generally with special intention to those using the Highways of the Province and to govern themselves accordingly.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF we have caused these Our Letters to be made Patent and the Great Seal of Prince Edward Island to be hereunto affixed.

WITNESS the Honourable Thomas William Lemuel Prowse, Our Lieutenant-Governor of Our Province of Prince Edward Island, at Our Government House in Charlottetown this twenty-ninth day of May in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fifty-two and in the first year of Our Reign.
