

Do You want a Pass?

Pass or no pass? That is the question that faces the Carnival Committee. It is this problem that we now present to the students.

These are the alternatives: there could be a pass, which would cost approximately \$7; or tickets could be sold for the individual events, which would cost a total of about \$8 (both these choices exclude the ball).

We would be able to sell a maximum of 500 passes, space being what it is. This leaves a thousand members of the university community without a chance to purchase a pass. At the different events, tickets will also be sold at the door. If the number of people at a particular event reaches the maximum, then no other students, including pass holders will be allowed into the event. If passes are sold, the individual ticket prices charged at the door will be greater than the cost of entry by means of a pass.

A pass will insure that the holder would not have to worry about budgeting his money to insure his ability to attend the events at the end of the carnival. A pass would also ensure that if the holder arrived early enough, his entry to the event would be guaranteed.

The second alternative is to sell no passes and give everyone an equal chance at getting into the events.

If you as a student, and hopefully a participant in the Winter Carnival have any strong views pro or con these arguments, then drop down to the SU office in the basement of Memorial Hall and tell us what they are. If you fail to contact us then the Student Union Executive and the Winter Carnival Committee will make the decision. After that don't bother to bring up any complaints to us because we'll, to put it bluntly, "Will not be interested."
