

CURRENT NOTES.

The prison profits at Sing Sing for January amounted to \$6,000. Over 5,000 patents on churns have already been granted by the Government. The mercury registered 129 deg. at Buenos Ayres, and the mortality is increasing. Col. Barnaby, it is said, has left the manuscript of a novel fiercely attacking political adversaries. Terror reigns in Vienna on account of the measures of repression adopted by the Government against anarchism. The Grand Trunk Railway have since the dynamite scare adopted all precautionary measures to guard the Victoria bridge. A Nova Scotia benefit society, which makes provisions for payments in cases of sickness, accident and death, is being organized in Stellarton.

Bismarck is said to be fashioning a scheme of colonial aggrandisement, in which he adopts the policy which has made England's possessions so vast.

It is proposed that all the distinguished literary men of the world should make prose and poetical tributes to Victor Hugo on the occasion of his 83rd birthday this month.

S. Liddell, of the township of Osprey, Grey county, claims to be the oldest man in Canada. He can prove, he says that his age is 108, and he can still walk, read and eat as well as most gentlemen of less advanced years.

Recent decisions in Illinois are to the effect that a liquor seller cannot shield himself behind the plea that he did not know his customer was drunk or a minor, but he must know that he is sober, or of age, as the case may be.

Judge Peters, of Maine, has been holding a Divorce Court, in Bangor. On Monday forenoon he allowed twelve divorces. In no less than nine of these the woman was the applicant. The causes were various—unfaithfulness, desertion, failure to support, extreme cruelty, etc.

Early childhood, as nature intended, should be free from all care. Children are born "heirs of the earth and skies," and all that comes to them is received without question or wonder. But, as they develop into maturity, they should gradually be taken into the confidence of the parents and made partners in the family interests.

Canadian merchants and manufacturers who have large mails save a third in their postage expenses, it is said, by sending their mail matter in bundles by express to the nearest Post Office on the United States side of the boundary line, where they mail it at the two-cent rate, whereas they would have to pay three cents if the matter were mailed on side.

The miners of Durham have taken the first practical step towards utilizing the recent changes in the English Constitution for democratic purposes. They resolved to run Workingmen's candidates for three out of thirteen constituencies in the county, and to pay £625. In London there is talk of running nine workingmen and raising a fund of £17,000.

The most talked about book of the day is George Eliot's "Life and Letters," by her second husband, who seems to be a born journalist, for he allows events to convey their own story in a connected sequence without injecting himself into the narrative or tincturing it with sympathy or prejudice of his own. The volumes throw no new light on the two marital romances of her life.

The dynamite outrage and scare are certain to result in a reorganization of the English detective force. It is probable that a new force of secret service men will be organized for the express purpose of tracking political and quasi-political offenders. This force will cooperate with similar bureaus at Paris, Berlin, Vienna, and St. Petersburg in giving each other warning of plots, and of the movements of suspected persons.

The Parnellites are very exultant over the recent reception of their leader and the proceedings of the Boundary Commissioners. Special attention is called to the honor paid to Mr. Parnell by Arnott, a wealthy Scotchman and proprietor of a strong anti-Parnellite journal in Dublin, and by Sir George Colthurst, a wealthy Tory landlord. The reappointment in Ulster will give the Parnellites several additional seats, and they now calculate on winning 87 out of the 103 Irish constituencies.

A London special says that in the Fortnightly, Mr. Irving has an article on 'American Audiences.' Dissecting its qualities, Mr. Irving keenly says:—"The dominant characteristics of an American audience is impartiality. They do not sit in judgment, resenting as positive offences a lack of power to convey meanings or a divergence in the interpretation of a particular character or scene. When they do not like a performance they simply go away. They are not only quick to understand and appreciate, but they take a genuine pleasure in the expression of approval. They are not surpassed in quickness and completeness of comprehension by any audience I have yet seen."

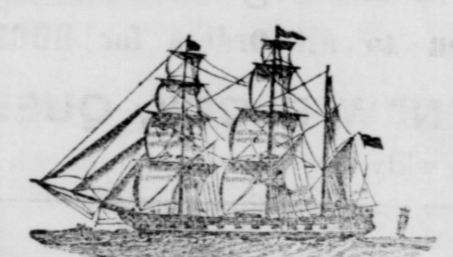

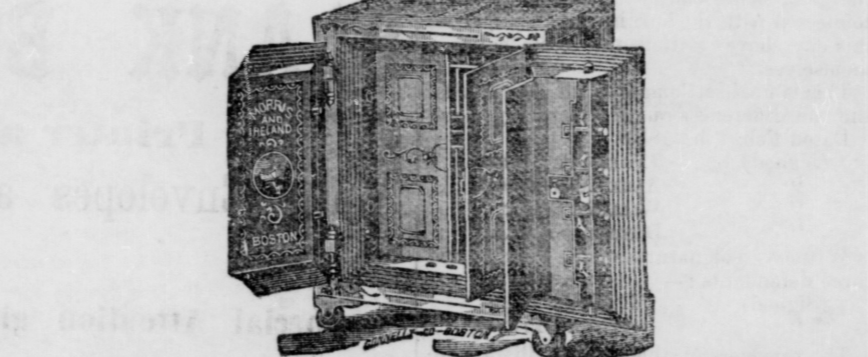
