Lakeville Bridge Once More.

Sir,—There appeared in the Patriot of the 17th ultimo, another communication, signed "Farmer" which must have been intended as a knockout blow for the "Poor Farmer's Boy." But although he was "struck below the belt" there is life in him yet. The machine has been hugged and with such vigor, that the spurious article signed "Farmer" has been the illegitimate offspring. But there are those of my acquaintance who, if they got their deserts, would not only be hung in a gallery but would be hung to the nearest branch of a tree, and left there as a warning to all evil doers.
