New Dairy Act Read In House

OTTAWA, June 26 — (CP)—The Government's new Dairy Products Act, revising Federal control over dairy products and dairy-product substitutes, was given first reading in the Commons.

Agriculture Minister Gardiner said the bill was necessitated by the decision of the Privy Council upholding a Supreme Court ruling in what has become known as the "margarine reference."

The Privy Council ruled that the Federal Government could not control the manufacture, sale and distribution of dairy products and their substitutes within a Province.

As a result the Minister said the manufacture and sale of dairy products no longer will be federally controlled and the new act will merely set up standards for dairy products and regulate interprovincial and international trade in them.

The Minister expressed the hope that the Commons will put the bill through all stages tomorrow when it comes up for second reading.
