Ambassador To Senegal Appointed

OTTAWA (CP)—Appointment of Jean Martial Cote, 44, of Quebec City as Canada's first resident ambassador to Senegal was announced Friday by the external affairs department.

The department also announced that Albert Frederick Hart, Canadian High Commissioner to Ghana, has been accredited as ambassador to Togo and Upper Volta.

Mr. Cote, a graduate of Laval and Queen's universities, joined the external affairs department in 1945 and has served in a number of foreign capitals.

Married with two children, he has been a counsellor with the Canadian High Commission office in London since 1962.

Baptist Group Votes To Merge

BROWN'S FLAT, N.E. (CP)—The Reformed Baptist Alliance, representing about 2,500 communicants in 50 congregations in Eastern Canada and the northeastern United States, voted Friday to merge with the 37,000-member Wesleyan Methodist Church of America.

More than 150 delegates attending the 78th and final annual meeting of the Reformed Baptist Alliance here voted for merger by an 85 per cent majority. They represented more than 60 Reformed Baptist churches in New Brunswick, Nova Scotia and Maine.

The Reformed Baptist Alliance will form the fourth largest of 28 Wesleyan Methodist conferences. The merger follows three years of negotiations between the churches.

At a general conference of the Wesleyan Methodists at Houghton, N.Y., in June, delegates voted unanimously to merge with the Reformed Baptist church. They also voted 130 to 33 to combine with the Pilgrim Holiness church.

COUPON DOWRY BEING SOUGHT

LONDON (AP)—John Beaumont advertised Thursday for a wife with a dowry of 4,500 cigarette coupons. He also wants a redhead.

"I think this is a good basis for a romance," he said. "For a start, it will mean that we'll have two things in common—smoking and collecting coupons."

Beaumont in a classified ad described himself as a bachelor, 44, lazy, self-centred, who has decided he is fed up with doing his own cooking, washing and housekeeping.

He offered himself, plus 4,500 cigarette coupons "in marriage to a suitable woman about the same age who can match the same amount of coupons as her dowry."

He said: "I like redheads and I most definitely want a redhead."

Roberts Wants New Tax Split

TORONTO (CP)—Premier John Roberts, unhappy with federal-provincial fiscal arrangements, is going to ask Ottawa to give more money to the provinces.

The premier told the legislature Friday "there is a great need for a change in the fiscal arrangements throughout our country as a whole."

The province wouldn't approach Ottawa for a handout but would ask for more money to fulfill its responsibilities under the constitution.

Surpluses enjoyed by the federal government should be shared among the provinces. "We simply had to increase taxes this year."
