**Gentile Belts Two Homers; Bowling Tourney Cubs Down Cincinnati 5-3 Results Released**

Home runs flew in all directions in both major baseball leagues Saturday as the boys teed off on tired, shell-shocked pitchers to produce such foot-bail-like scores as 14-2, 11-9, 9-0 and 8-4.

Jim Gentile, a legitimate home-run swatted, banged two, Bobby Knopp hit one, a grand slam. And Felipe Alou had an inside-the-park job among the near two-dozen homers.

There were five home runs in a 5-4 triumph by Boston Red Sox over Kansas City Athletics. Besides Gentile's pair for Kansas City, homers were hit by Bob Tillman, Roman Mejias and Felix Mantilla of the Red Sox. Mantilla's came in the ninth in a pinch-hit role with a man on base to turn defeat into victory.

Three homers were among

the 17 hits amassed by Chicago White Sox in their 14-3 slaughter of Washington Senators. They were slugged by Dave Nicholson, Pete Ward, a native of Montreal, and Tommy McGraw. Ward's was a grand slam.

**SURE INTO LEAD**  
Knopp's four-run homer enabled Los Angeles Angels to come from behind and defeat New York Yankees 9-5. Mickey Mantle homered for the losers.

There was his seventh of the season and 428th of his career, tying him for the top mark among active players with Eddie Mathews of Milwaukee Braves.

Leon Wagner knocked in five runs with a home run and single as Cleveland Indians outslugged Detroit Tigers 11-9.

Dick McAuliffe had a homer for the Tigers.

Oddy enough, Minnesota

Twins, who lead both leagues in home runs, didn't hit any in their 5-1 victory over Baltimore Orioles. There was one Baltimore homer, by Boog Powell, which deprived Lee Stange of a shutout.

Rico Carty, a rookie outfielder, walloped two home runs for Milwaukee as the Braves downed St. Louis Cardinals 8-1. Bill White hit one for the Cards. Alou and Henry Aaron also homered for the Braves.

Jerry Lynch and Roberto Clemente were Pittsburgh's homer killers as the Pirates swamped San Francisco Giants 9-2. He had Bob Friend's five-hitter. Willie Mays was held to a double in four times at bat, dropping his average to an even .400.
