## Movement of Prairie Grain In High Gear

**WINNIPEG (CP)**—The opening of navigation on the Great Lakes this week has touched off an enormous chain reaction from the Lakehead across the prairies as piled-up grain begins to move. Influenced by optimistic reports from Agriculture Minister Gardiner that heavy orders from European countries will help clear the grain glut "right away," activity in the west is speeding up. Rail shipments are expected to accelerate next week as the giant terminal spouts at Fort William and Port Arthur pour the 73,000,000 bushels of grain at the Twin Cities into the freighters, before the start of the shipping season. Railway car unloading at the Lakehead has quickened at about 900 a day from an average of 250 six weeks ago. Nearly 10,000,000 bushels in 4,500 cars on track at the opening of navigation are rapidly being unloaded and replaced by new shipments.

**HEAVIER LOADINGS**

E. E. Baxter, chief statistician of the board of grain commissioners, said Friday country points were reporting heavier loadings, up to 350,000 bushels a day. The board of transport commissioners said there were 3,600 cars on track at the lakehead Friday with about 2,300 more ready to move in. Country points Thursday loaded 1,200 cars.

Mr. Gardiner's prediction that "this crop year will see us take in more cash from our farms than ever before" came as the bureau of statistics reported that Canadian farmers' cash income declined by \$42,700,000 in 1955 to a five-year low of \$2,352,600,000, about \$500,000,000 below the record \$2,849,300,000 of 1952.

## Women's Group Opposes Ban On Russians

**OTTAWA (CP)**—Disappointed in attempts to protest to Immigration Minister Pickersgill over a ban on a visit by five Russian women, a delegation of the Congress of Canadian Women Friday sought interviews from other government officials and members of Parliament.

Mr. Pickersgill left the capital early Friday for a reunion of Dutch Canadians at Chatham, Ont., Friday night. He said in the Commons Wednesday that the Russian women would not be permitted entry under auspices of Communist or Communist-front organizations. "The congress has been making arrangements for the tour. The delegation included 10 women from Toronto, Montreal and Ottawa headed by national president Mrs. Rae Luckock of Toronto.

The congress has been reported as a Communist front organization, although Mr. Pickersgill did not mention it. Mrs. Luckock said in a statement issued in Toronto, the organization "is non-political embracing Canadian women with many different religious and political beliefs."

She termed the ruling an "inhospitable act" considering the "warm friendly welcome" received by External Affairs Minister Pearson, Fisheries Minister Sinclair, the Canadian Women's Press Club and president J. S. Duncan of the Massey-Harris-Ferguson Company during visits to Russia last year.

**CHICAGO (AP)**—The home of Earl W. (Mad Man) Muntz and his bride of two months, model agency head Patricia Stevens, was looted Friday night of an estimated \$50,000 in cash, furs and jewelry. Muntz is the flamboyant used car boom who later branched out into manufacture of television sets and expensive sports automobiles. Muntz TV Inc. is undergoing reorganization under the Federal Bankruptcy Act.
