MADELINE.

It was in Brighton, about nine o'clock, on one of those cold, blustering evenings of storm and wind that generally usher in the month of November. The streets were almost deserted, and the flickering gas, whose flames were invaded by the searching blast, gave an unsteady and sickly light to the lonely thoroughfare, as a tall, emaciated man, dressed in worn and shabby habiliments, walked with trembling and unsteady steps down the broad footway.

Occasionally, from bodily weakness or the piercing blast that impeded his exhausted frame, he grasped the iron railings to support his weary body and his fainting progress.

At length, and after many paces, the giant figure stopped before the steps of the largest mansion in the street, and as he clutched firmly the railings to steady his rapidly increasing debility, a faint smile of intense joy radiated for a moment the sunken eyes and hollow features of the sinking man.

The next instant he was succeeded by a brief suffusion of the face—his eyes closed, his hands relaxed their hold of the spikes, the knees doubled under, and the body sank heavily on the pavement without sense or motion.
