## Graduate School Money Opportunities

Lots and lots! You will have to drop by the Department of Student Services in order to find out about them. The Association of Universities and Colleges of Canada publishes a list of 125 awards available for graduate students. Perhaps one suits you perfectly and only needs your application for it.

## Undergraduate Money Opportunities

1. *Robert and Mary Stanfield Foundation Undergraduate Bilingual Exchange Scholarships in Canadian Studies. Feb. 1st Deadline*

To improve understanding between French-speaking and English-speaking Canadians. The scholarships will be awarded to assist the winners in their ongoing studies related to Canada, its cultures, people and institutions and to encourage their personal development in anticipation of their greater contribution to Canadian society.

2. *Queen Elizabeth Silver Jubilee Endowment Fund Program: Feb. 15 Deadline* This award was established by the Government of Canada to encourage young Canadians who wish to improve their proficiency in their second language. Its wish is also that these student pursue studies in that language.

3. *Beta Sigma Phi: The Dorothy and Walter Ross Memorial Scholarship*

The person must be a member of Beta Sigma Phi or the son or daughter of a member of Beta Sigma Phi. The applicant must also have good character and good standing, class ranking-high, and have done well on scholastic Aptitude Tests. An autobiography written by the student outlining goals of study, recommendation of high school or college authorities, and recommendation of chapter or city council are required.

4. *Catholic Women's League Bursary*

Available for Catholic, Female students attending a post-secondary educational institution. Information concerning your parents and their occupations, the number in you family, and your financial situation, is requested. Comments of your Pastor is required.

5. *Chemistry and Biochemistry Summer Undergraduate Research Assistantship: May-August at the Guelph-Waterloo Centre*

Undergraduates in Honours Chemistry, Biochemistry, and related areas.

Each successful applicant will collaborate with a Centre faculty member on a research project and within the limits of availability, will have the opportunity of choosing his/her area of research, supervisor, and campus.

6. *Children of War Dead (Education Assistance) Act*

You must commence studies within 15 months of your graduation from secondary school. If approved, you may receive assistance up to and including the academic year in which you reach your thirtieth birthday.

\$1500.00 per annum towards the tuition and a monthly training allowance of \$110.62

7. *Orville Erikson Memorial Scholarship Fund:*

Conservation Competent, full-time students must be in need.

Scholarship applications may be submitted at any time throughout the year. Trustees will evaluate applications in June and December.

*Harvey Moore Wildlife Fund Scholarship:*

This scholarship is awarded annually to any person(s) attending the University of Prince Edward Island and studying Biology or other suitable field study there, and showing a special interest in wildlife conservation and aptitude for its promotion.

9. *The UPEI Memorial Bursary Fund:*

Students who apply use the same form so that the scholarship

Committee can consider them for all of the available awards.

10. *UPEI Leadership Awards:*

Students eligible for a leadership award must be full-time students who have satisfied the entrance requirements to the University or who have passed at least eight three-semester hour courses in the previous year of study. Students who have enrolled in less than eight courses in the previous year will normally be expected to complete all of the courses in which she/he was enrolled.

Awards will be given to students who have made, are making, or have demonstrated the potential for making a significant

leadership contribution to University life.

Awards may be given to students participating in University athletic activities but only if the student demonstrates significant leadership through her participation.

Nominations for awards may be made by students, faculty, or staff of the University. Recipients for the awards will be chosen by a committee appointed by the President of the University.

In the 1987/88 school year there were six awards of \$600.00 each given.


The deadline is announced every year, but is usually during the second semester.

11. *The McEuen Undergraduate Scholarship for the Study in Scotland:*

The scholarship is tenable for a three-year course of studies toward an ordinary degree or a four-year course toward an honours degree. It is renewable from year to year on the basis of satisfactory performance. Applicants must not be more than 21 years of age and must be attending uni-

**DESCRIPTION OF PRIZES**
