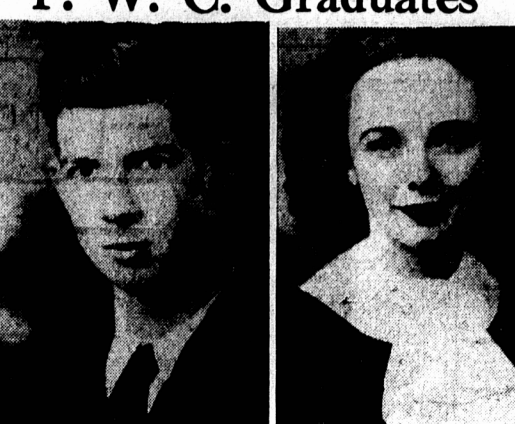

P. W. C. Graduates



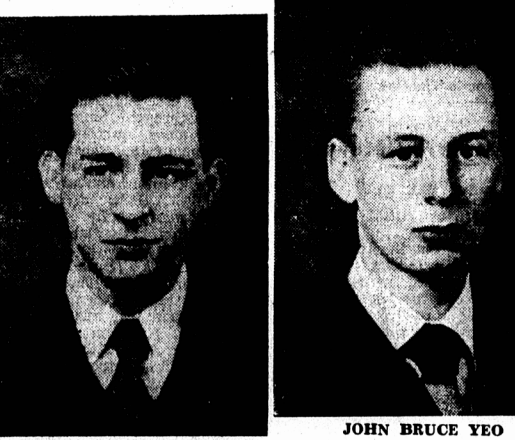
FREDERICK WALLACE STEWART
