Kitchen-Clean Is Standard HAMILTON, Ont. (CP) - Kitchen clean is the standard required by inspectors for the combustion chambers of Dominion Foundries and Steel Limited's \$13,800,000 battery of 38 new coke ovens. Special crews use giant vacuum cleaners to suck dust particles from the heating zones between the nearly completed ovens so gases used to heat the coal will be free from impurities. Each oven will be equipped with smokeless charging devices. Special equipment will be installed to prevent sewer contamination, a move in line with Dofasco's policy of working closely with the Ontario Water Resources Commission to clean up the waters of Hamilton Bay, a company spokesman said Thursday. The new ovens, which will increase Dofasco's coke-producing capacity by 50 per cent, are scheduled to be operating by 1967 as part of the current \$100,000,000 expansion program.

MRS. T.W.L. PROWSE OBITUARY Inserted by the family - A prominent Charlottetown resident, Mrs. T.W.L. Prowse, of 17 Villa Avenue, died early on Monday morning, July 18th, 1966. She had been in failing health since the beginning of this year. Mrs. Prowse, the former Annie, Martyr of Ripley, Ontario, met her husband in Vancouver where he was with the Royal Bank of Canada and she was engaged in a retail business of her own. Following their marriage they returned to Mr. Prowse's native Province upon his transfer as Manager of the Hunter's River Branch. When he died the family firm, Prowse Brothers, they took up residence in Charlottetown. Mrs. Prowse was very active in many community organizations. She was a Past President of the Brighton Group of the Kirk of St. James, where she was an active member of the Women's Auxiliary. She was a National Life Member of the Imperial Order Daughters of the Empire, and a Life Member of the Royal Edward Chapter. She was the Honorary President of the Bellevue Golf and Winter Club. She was a Past President of the Prince Edward Island Women's Liberal Club. She was a Life Member of the Prince Edward Island Music Festival Association and of the Canadian Council of the Girl Guide Association. In 1956 she was presented with an award for outstanding service to the movement. She was a life member of the Queen's Mary Needlework Guild and a charter member of the Charlottetown Duplicate Bridge Club. In November of last year she was recognized with a badge for twenty-five years of continuous voluntary service in the Canadian National Institute for the Blind. During the Honourable T.W.L. Prowse's tenure of office as Provincial Governor of this Province, she was the gracious and charming chairlady in such distinguished occasions as Her Royal Highness, Queen Elizabeth II and Her Royal Highness, Princess Philip, Lord Home British High Commissioner to Canada, who later became the Prime Minister of Great Britain. She leaves to mourn her husband, the Honourable T.W.L. Prowse, and the following family: Dr. Lemuel J. Prowse, of Charlottetown; Dr. Doris J. Prowse, of Toronto; Margaret, Mrs. F. H. A. MacLennan, Brookville; Pauline, Mrs. W. Alan Ford, Halifax. She is also survived by eleven grandchildren and one great-grandchild. The funeral was held from the Kirk of St. James on Wednesday July 20th with the services conducted by the Reverend Malcolm A. McQuaid. Interment was in the People's Cemetery.
