**PROVINCIAL LEGISLATURE**

FRIDAY, April 28.

House met at 11.

Mr. Campbell asked the Commissioner of Public Works if he has instructed Supervisor McGuigan to seek the rebuilding of the bridges on the Centre Line Road on that portion of it that has been altered by the said Supervisor, and which has been condemned at a public meeting held in Hope River Hall, which was largely attended by both Liberals and Conservatives.

Hon. Mr. McLean said the supervisor had been instructed to sell those bridges subject to the approval of the Commissioner of Public Works.

Mr. Richards asked the Commissioner of Public Works what action the Department of Public Works intends to take respecting the numerous petitions from the inhabitants of McIsaac Road and adjoining Districts, praying for the completion of the new road from Line Road, between Lots 13 and 14, to St. Gilbert's, Lot 14.

Hon. Mr. McLean said that some government money had been spent on this road, and it was nothing but fair that it should be continued.

Mr. M. McKinnon asked the Leader of the Government to table a statement giving the names of all those employed in the Hospital for the Insane and the salaries received by each, also the latest report of the Poor House Commissioners and an itemized report of the expenses of that Institution.

Hon. Mr. Farquharson promised that the information would be laid on the table this afternoon.

The debate on the Hillsborough Bridge bill was then resumed by Mr. Shaw. He was followed by Hon. Mr. Richards, Mr. A. J. McDonald, and Mr. Campbell.

**French Wives Provided.**

PARIS, April 26.—In consequence of the complaints of French colonists that it is impossible for them to find French wives unless they return home, the Ministry of the Colonies intend to install a central emigration office for women in Paris, with branches in the country. Approved candidates who are considered suitable for colonial marriages will be provided with a wedding outfit, costing \$60, with \$20 pocket-money, and with a free passage to the colony selected. The first experiments will be made in Madagascar.

**SCHOOL REPORT.**

SIS.—The Chief Superintendent of Education, in his report, says that as there are three grades of license so should there be three grades of schools. This conclusion was doubtless arrived at from the fact that many teachers doing but inferior third-class work are drawing 2nd class pay. We agree with Mr. McLeod that this latter state of affairs should be ratified but take exception to his position in re three grades of schools.

We assume, as a premises, that the state is in duty bound to give a certain amount of education to its people irrespective of creed or nationality. This Education should be broad and absolutely necessary for every one; and in this country be more along the lines of farming, dairying and fruit growing, the principal industries to which our Island is adapted and which must be the chief occupation of our people. This settled, we submit that every teacher obtaining license should be qualified to impart this necessary instruction, and all should be paid the same salary from the common purse, irrespective of sex. In other words pay for labor preformed, irrespective of the sex of the labourer. We are not all equal. The back woods school is on a par with the village, which is just, and in contrast to the system lately in practice of forcing the poorer districts to contribute indirectly to the support of the rich ones or the city. Now if any individual or number of individuals termed on village or town wishes a high-grade teacher, let them have one by paying the extra cost themselves. Every one should be prepared to pay for their own luxuries. Now you have a system fair and just to all. A central training school or college should be maintained by the province, and students who wish to take advanced courses should pay the tuition fee necessary. Let Latin and Greek go to those whose time lies heavy on their hands. Time is too short to waste on impractical, however valuable, studies. Our province is agricultural, if anything, and we cannot afford to keep up a college almost exclusively to train our youth in professions, already full to overflowing, to despise the farms of their fathers or give their services to foreign countries.

Our colleges are producing too many drones in the hive of industry. So soon as a man gets a little education, he considers himself of rather too much importance to go back to the farm. He has the now too common idea that a man to be somebody must get some petty filly and sport a bike and cigarette. Let our colleges endeavor to dispel this erroneous idea, and inculcate into the minds of our youth the fact that farming is one of the highest, if not the very highest and most interesting of occupations; and teach them to judge people by quality of heart and mind rather than by the method of earning their bread. When we can persuade our educated youth to employ their talents on the farm rather than waste them as second rate preachers, lawyers or doctors, it will be a gala day for our country.

But we are digressing. To sum up, our position is:

- 1st, One grade of Government salary for all schools in the Province.
- 2nd, Let districts desiring something higher than is the duty of the province to give—pay for it themselves.
- 3rd, More practical work and less Latin and Greek at our central high school.

**EXPECTS AN EQUIVALENT**

**Britain Willing to Abrogate the Clayton-Bulwer Treaty.**

NEW YORK, April 26.—A Herald despatch from Washington says:—Although willing to abrogate the Clayton-Bulwer treaty, Great Britain has made it plain to the United States that she expects an equivalent in return for her action.

The equivalent will be exacted during negotiations of the American-Canadian Commission, which is to resume its session in Washington in August next. It is because of a demand for concessions equal in value to that which will be given the United States in the abrogation of the Clayton-Bulwer treaty that the negotiations have not progressed with the promptness at first expected.

It is apparent to the officials now that Great Britain purposes to use the proposition to abrogate the treaty to further her own aims in connection with the settlement of the Alaskan boundary and reciprocity questions. Great Britain is determined to make every effort to secure an outlet for the North West Territory through Alaska. And the United States is not willing to give it to her. It may be therefore that she will suggest that in return for such an outlet she will surrender all her rights in the Nicaragua canal.

President McKinley and Secretary Hay have determined not to enter into negotiations either with Costa Rica or Nicaragua respecting the Nicaragua canal until the new Isthmian canal commission has submitted its report. The Nicaragua canal commission will report within a short time, and the President will then announce the members of the Isthmian commission. The new commission will proceed to Panama, and later to Nicaragua, and it is the expectation of the President that it will submit its report in time for consideration early in the next session of Congress.
