Canadian Unit In Korea - Japan Lift

TOKYO, April 9—(Reuters)—A Canadian unit has joined the Korea-Japan airlift for the first time. It is a team of five R. C. A. F. men who are making daily flights with experienced men of the American 61st Carrier Group to become familiar with the route.

The unit also includes an American navigator.

The Canadians are Ptl.-Lt. J. A. Watt of Montreal; FO R. A. Spratt of Ottawa; FO E. H. Moberg, of Saskatoon; FO C. G. Jessup of North Bay, Ont.; and AC Bob Rogers of Kelowna, B. C.

They are all members of the R. C. A. F. 426th Transport Squadron, based on Tacoma, Wash., which has been helping the Americans since last July.

The Japan-Korea airlift serves to fly fresh troops and cargo to the battle area and carry casualties to Japan on the return flight.
