**Found Guilty Of Manslaughter**

HALIFAX (CP)—A Supreme Court petit jury deliberated one hour here Tuesday to convict Able Seaman Fred Hind, 19, of Windsor, Ont., of manslaughter. The jury recommended clemency.

Hind was charged with murder Aug. 8 when shipmate, AB Ross McCallum of Toronto and Midland, Ont., died from a stab wound after a scuffle aboard H.M.C.S. Lauzon in Halifax harbor.

The charge was reduced to manslaughter at the end of the preliminary hearing. Hind was remanded for sentence at the end of the court term.

Witnesses said Hind and McCallum were always "on friendly terms." Able Seaman R.S. Sutton told the court he witnessed the scuffle and saw McCallum stagger toward a bunk "holding onto his chest." Sutton said he helped the victim to the ship's sickbay where he died.

Three seamen testified they had seen Hind with a "switchblade knife" a week before the stabbing. Several knives were produced in court, but there was no evidence that Hind owned any of them.
