IN MEMORIAM

MAJOR WENDELL WORTH Friends throughout the Province and abroad were saddened to learn of the death in the Prince Edward Island Hospital on Thursday, February 19th, 1959, of Major Wendell Howard Worth, M.S.M., E.D., of Charlottetown, Prince Edward Island at the age of sixty-two years, following a prolonged illness.

Born in Windsor, Nova Scotia, son of the late Ada Wootton and John Howard Worth, the late Mr. Worth moved to Charlottetown at an early age where he resided until his death.

Enlisting in the Signal Corps during the first World War, he went overseas with the unit under command of Lt. Col. D.A. MacKinnon, and was later awarded the Meritorious Service Medal while serving with the 43rd Battery, Royal Canadian Artillery. He again enlisted in the second World War, returning overseas as Paymaster of the West Nova Scotia Regiment.

For the past twelve years of the late Mr. Worth was Manager of Dalvay by the Sea Hotel in the National Park, until his retirement last autumn. The late Mr. Worth also operated his own Insurance Agency.

Left to mourn his passing are his wife, the former Margaret Catherine Mutch, also two brothers, Mr. Reginald Y. Worth and Mr. Clifford Worth, presently residing in the United States of America.

Possessed of a kindly and friendly manner, the late Mr. Worth will be sadly missed by his many friends in the community.

Funeral service was held on Saturday afternoon, February seventh, from his late residence, 185, Euston Street to the Kirk of St. James Presbyterian Church where service was conducted by the Minister, the Rev. T. H. B. Somers assisted by the Rev. A. Frank MacLean of Trinity United Church. Officers of the Signal Corps, the Canadian Legion and the staff of Dalvay Hotel attended in a body.

The music was under the direction of the Church Organist, Miss E. Lillian MacKenzie; hymns sung being two of the favourites of the deceased - "Unto the Hills Around Do I Lift Up My Longings" and "Breathe On Me Breath of God." Interment was in Sherwood Cemetery where the Legion Service at the grave was read by Mr. Pius Smith, President of the Canadian Legion, B.E.S.L. Last Post and Reveille were sounded by bugler, D. Mill.
