The shipment per Bonavista to-day closes the work of the Charlottetown relief committee. The following is a list of goods making up the two shipments per Bonavista:

98 barrels flour, 224 bags flour, 44 barrels pork, 13 barrels beef, 432 bags and 18 barrels potatoes, 140 bags (558 bush) oats, 3 bags wheat, 2 barrels and 1 box biscuit, 4 tubs and 1 crock butter, 1 case cheese, 2 cheeses, 4 cases lobsters, 7 boxes and 1 chest tea, 1 box beans, 4 cases canned meat, 2 tins lard, 3 parcels bacon, 1 bag rice, 30 cases dry goods and clothing, 1 punchbowl molasses, 8 tons hay, 7 bundles window sashes.

The value of these shipments will exceed \$5,000. In addition the cattle, sheep, etc., per each Congo, amounted in value to \$10,000, making a grand total of over \$6,000. A closing statement will be submitted in a few days.
