EDUCATIONAL HORIZON

Adopt An Educational Program For 1959

Kenneth Parker, Superintendent of City Schools

For those concerned with education, 1958 was a most significant year. In it the first Conference on Education was held in Ottawa on the national level. Thus 1959 becomes equally significant, presenting, as it does, an opportunity to translate into action some of the recommendations and objectives coming out of the Conference.

QUALIFICATIONS. Satisfaction must also be expressed with substantial advances made in education in 1958 by legislation introduced by our Department of Education. Among the more important was the reclassification of teachers' licenses based on academic and professional qualifications, setting the minimum requirements for teacher training at Junior Matriculation (Grade 12 or Second Year P.W.C.) and the establishment of the P.E.I. Board of Teacher Education and Standards. However, any analysis of our position at the beginning of 1959 must look at both our successes and shortcomings. To ignore the implications of the latter would be a serious disservice not only to the
