Shady Advertising Seen Growing Business Threat

MONTREAL (OP)—When is a bargain a bargain? When some method is used to convey the suggestion of a price concession, says Claude Root, general manager of the Better Business Bureau of Montreal. But from this stems the danger that the retail market "tends to become a colossal bargain basement—things like service, quality and even value itself lose all meaning," he warns. Out of this interpretation of a bargain also arises the prevalent abuse of comparatives and too many shoppers are sharing the idea never to believe a merchant's first offer, never to buy at a stated retail price and that it's smart to haggle, he adds. Mr. Root had a word of warning to retailers and manufacturers.
