Moore Gains in Fight to Try to Defeat Creditors

NEW YORK (AP) — Supreme Court Justice Earl Warren ruled Thursday that Archie Moore, Light-heavyweight boxer, was not sane when he sued to set aside a California judgment by setting up a California trust to protect himself from creditors.

In a five-page opinion, Justice Warren recommended that a fighter's \$82,000 purse from a light-heavyweight title bout be placed in a trust.

In 1961 he tied up winding up outcome of a suit brought against him by Feature Sports Co.

Feature Sports is suing Moore for \$200,000 charging him with having received \$100,000 from the German's Erich Schoepfer in August 1960, a suit that is being promoted by Feature Sports.

Included in the damage done to an advance of \$40,000 Moore is contesting the suit, the fight, according to the plaintiff.

In August 1961, Feature Sports set up Moore's purse in connection with his suit. But Moore argued that the funds do not belong to him but to the corporation which he had created.

Justice Arthur Marchese decided in favor of Moore. He ordered Justice Arthur Marchese to order Moore to pay \$100,000 to the corporation.

Wimbledon, England (CP)

— The dominance of Australia in men's tennis was strikingly demonstrated Thursday in the third round of the Wimbledon singles event. Of 16 survivors, eight were Australians, including all of that country's top-ranked stars.

Rod Laver, defending champion and top-seeded, produced a fine brand of tennis to outwit Whitney Reed, top-ranked in the U.S., 6-4, 6-1, 6-0.

Second-seeded Australian Royall Fred Stolle 64, 3-4, 6-0.

And third-seeded Neale Fraser 6-2, 6-4, 6-1.

Emerson put off follow-Australian Fred Stolle 64-6-4, 5-0.

And third-seeded Neale Fraser topped Britain's Billy Knight 6-4, 6-1, 6-0.

Bob Hewitt, seeded eighth, defeated Billy Wilson of Britain 6-4, 6-2, 6-4, 7-5.

Other Aussies in the last 16 are: Bob Howe, who defeated P. N. Lall of India and Ken Fletcher, who dented Mike Hant of Britain. Howe is the man who knocked fifth-seeded Chuck McKinley of the U.S. out of the fourth round of Wimbledon.

Three U.S. women moved into the last 16 in their section, including Miss Smith, who now is a firm favorite to win the women's singles. Thursday she shut out Mrs. Eva De Jong of the Netherlands 6-0, 6-0.

Top-seeded Australian Margaret Smith was ousted in the second round of play Tuesday.

The conqueror of Miss Smith, Billie Jean Moffitt of the U.S., continued to advance with a 6-3 victory over longtime friend, Coralee Caldwell of the U.S.
