

Being Traded To Tigers Makes Eddie Yost Happy

SOUTH OZONE PARK, N.Y. (AP)—"I read in the papers that Detroit and three other teams were after me. I was hoping it would be the Tigers. A few days later it happened."
This was Eddie Yost discussing the recent trade that sent him into the Tigers' den from Washington. The 32-year-old veteran third baseman of 12 seasons with the Senators, lives here with his parents.
"It's a good break," added Yost, who is also the league's player representative. "It should give me more of an incentive playing with a better ball club."
"But it certainly will be strange

not being with the Senators after so many years. You think back about the many nice things that happened... like the day in 1953 when they had an Eddie Yost day in Griffith Stadium. My mother came to see me play for the first time. I got two hits and got on base four times... and we won the game.

"Then there was the time in 1948 when we won all our games on a western road trip. They had a big parade for us in Washington."
"There was another big thrill in the opening game of last season. I made a couple of diving catches including one very im-

portant one on Jackie Jensen with the bases loaded. The next day I read that President Eisenhower said he got a big kick out of those stops.
"I think the thing I'm most likely to remember, though, is playing under Bucky Harris. He taught me a lot."
Yost batted only .224 in 134 games last season. He led the third basemen in fielding with a .964 mark. His lifetime batting average is .253.
A five-foot, 10-inch, 185-pounder, Yost moved to Detroit along with shortstop Rocky Bridges in exchange for infielders Reno Bertoia and Ron Samford, outfielder Jim Delsing and cash.

Mullins Criticizes Officials Of Can. Team At Games

LINCOLN, Neb. (AP)—Collegiate runner Joe Mullins criticized officials of last summer's Canadian team at the British Empire Games Wednesday and declared they have no grounds for seeking his suspension from the Amateur Athletic Union of Canada.
Mullins, 20, from Glace Bay,

N.S., is a junior at the University of Nebraska.
General manager Bob Osborne of Vancouver recommended to the AAU of C it suspend an athlete over an incident during a party in London.
"I'm not quite positive," said

Mullins, "That Osborne was talking about me." Even if he was not, the runner added, he is standing by his criticism of the team officials.
Mullins said he believed the incident involved his taking a girl to the room where he was billeted at the Imperial College in London. He said the two had talked for a while and then he took her to catch a train. Osborne and Neil Farrell, the AAU of C track and field manager, asked him for an explanation the next day, he said.
The first he heard about the suspension move, said Mullins, was when he read about it in a Toronto paper. He later wrote Toronto Globe and Mail columnist Scott Young and then talked to him by phone.
Detailing his comments about the officials Wednesday, Mullins claimed they were incompetent and that the team organization was very poor.
"The only drinking an athlete did was at receptions when the officials were present," he said. "Osborne, Farrell and the whole lot were always there."

Moore Receives Hero's Welcome

SAN DIEGO, Calif. (AP)—Light heavyweight champion Archie Moore, who was named "fighter of the year," came home Wednesday to a hero's welcome. Moore, usually a glib talker, was almost speechless after hearing the praise of city and county dignitaries. All he could say was: "I'm very happy to see all of you here. I had not expected such a turnout and did not prepare a speech. I would like to say now that I'm so full of gratitude that I can't convey my feelings."
Last week Moore turned in what he termed "the most sensational fight of my career" in retaining his championship with an 11th-round knockout of Yvon Durelle in Montreal.
The Boxing Writers Association named Moore recipient of the Edward J. Neil memorial plaque as "fighter of the year." The association trophy is awarded annually in memory of The Associated Press writer who died in 1938 while covering the war in Spain.
