### GRADUATE STUDIES IN SOCIAL WORK

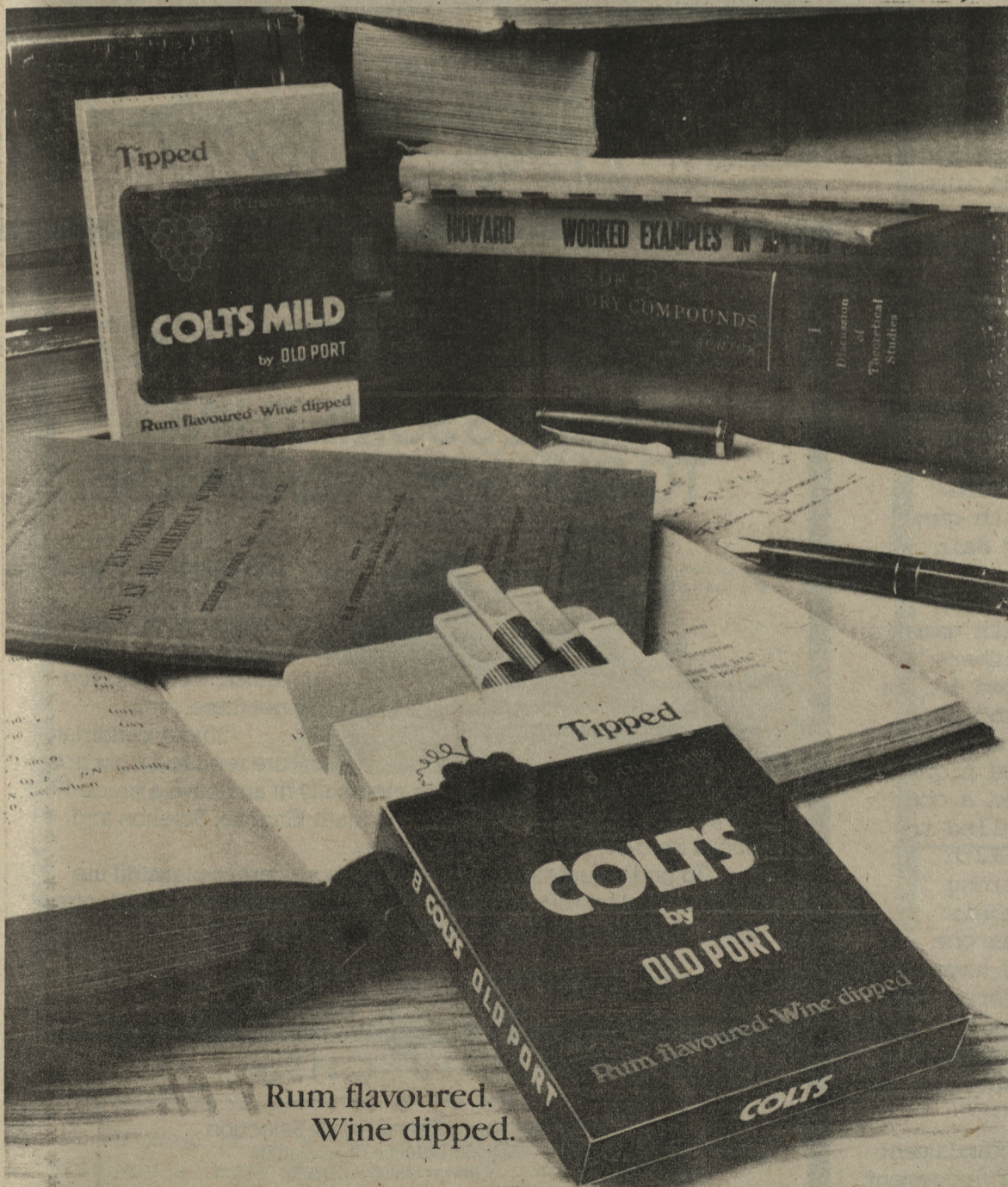
Carleton University offers a full-time and part-time program of study leading to the Master of Social Work degree.
