## IN MEMORIAM

MRS. W.E. PROFITT  
Mrs. William Edward Profitt  
passed peacefully away at her  
home at Burlington on September  
25th, bringing gentle release to a  
spirit bound to a body weakened  
by a series of illnesses over the  
past eleven years. Formerly Laura  
MacLeod, she was born at Kennington  
eighty-four years ago, a  
daughter of Hugh MacLeod and  
his wife, Margaret Haslam. From  
the time of her marriage in 1883  
to William Edward Profitt until  
her death she lived on the Profitt  
homestead.

Her pride and pleasure was in  
her family, and in her home where  
she and her husband extended hospi-  
tality to all who crossed their  
threshold and where friends and  
neighbors spent many happy hours.  
She was a regular worshipper in  
St. Stephen's Anglican Church.  
For many years she sang in the  
church choir, and was a faithful  
member of the Women's Auxiliary.  
Following her husband's death in  
1943, her health began to fail vary-  
ing in degree until a ten day se-  
rious illness proved fatal.

Left to mourn the loss of a de-  
voted mother are one son Fred at  
home, and three daughters, Besie,  
Mrs. Stanley Sherritt, and  
Fannie, both in Malden, Mass.,  
and Myrtle, Mrs. Harold Payving  
of Saugus, Mass. Also surviving  
are one brother, H.B. MacLeod of  
Burlington, three grand-children  
and three great-grand-children.  
The funeral was held on Septem-  
ber 27th from St. Stephen's Church  
Burlington, after a short service  
at the home, and was conducted by  
her minister, Rev. W. Eric In-  
gram. The hymns "Abide with  
Me", and "Safe in the Arms of  
Jesus", were sung with Mrs. W.J.  
Profitt at the organ. The body was  
carried to its last resting place be-  
side that of her husband in the  
church burial ground, by six neigh-  
bors and friends of the family:  
Willard Brown, Borden Campbell,  
James Evans, William J. Profitt,  
Leigh Paynter and Ellis Profitt.  
The many beautiful floral offer-  
ings bore silent tribute to the mem-  
ory of one who was held in af-

## N. B. Safety League Reports Fewer Accidents

SAINT JOHN (CP) - A drop in  
the number of traffic accidents  
was reported here at the monthly  
meeting of the New Brunswick  
Traffic Safety League.

Accident figs given by Law-  
rence Hachey, Registrar of Motor  
vehicles, showed the total to date  
this year as 3,855 compared with  
4,160 in 1955. Fatalities also were  
down, at 94 and 88, respectively.  
Motor vehicle registration in-  
creased 10 per cent during the  
past year and there were 20 per  
cent more drivers. About 1,000  
more licences were issued this  
year—some 6,000 for passenger  
cars. Registrations were expected  
to exceed 100,000 next year.

This year, to the end of Septem-  
ber, 4,850 violations were reported  
under the motor vehicle act and  
3,594 warning letters were sent.  
Ten suspensions occurred under  
the points system and there were  
40 interviews. Suspensions under  
682, including 483 for impairment.  
In the corresponding period last  
year 768 suspensions were ordered.  
For the first year of the R.C.M.P.  
traffic patrol \$15,000 was collected  
in fines in 1954, \$37,000 in 1955 and  
\$45,000 so far this year.

## Commerce Chamber Gives Credit Expansion Views

QUEBEC (CP) - Santa Claus  
as a retailer, he was not con-  
cerned about the consumer-credit  
situation.  
"I consider," he stated, "that  
Canadian consumers have all-  
time-high purchasing power, full  
employment, all-time-high sav-  
ings, and that in this abundant  
market of commodities consum-  
ers should be afforded the op-  
portunity to buy at good prices  
and use the credit being extended  
to them by banks financial insti-  
tutions and retailers."  
"I suggest that what we should  
be afraid of is fear itself. We  
should ban that and concentrate  
our efforts on developing this  
buoyant economy. I don't believe  
there should be government con-  
trols on consumer credit except  
in case of war."  
INFLATION BOGEYMAN?  
A newspaper man asked: "Is  
talk of inflation then just a bogey-  
man?"  
R. C. Pybus, president of Com-  
monwealth Construction Company  
Vancouver, and the chamber's  
first national vice-president, re-  
plied that inflation is not just a  
bogeyman.  
It has real meaning today for

those with fixed incomes. Further,  
Canada and perhaps especially  
British Columbia, depend on ex-  
ports and "we must be able to  
sell our goods or we can't employ  
our people."  
G. Arnold Hart, deputy general  
manager, Bank of Montreal, and  
the Chamber's honorary treasurer  
said inflation is a real problem  
and actions by the Bank of Can-  
ada are merely efforts to "spread  
out" a boom. Under the anti-in-  
flationary measures some parts  
of the economy might suffer, but  
in the long-run the effects would  
level out.  
LIFE TRIAL AND ERROR  
John T. Bryden, vice-president  
and general manager, North Amer-  
ican Life Assurance Company and  
the Chamber's associate hono-  
rary treasurer, answering a  
question as to when wages  
could be higher than the country  
could pay, said:  
"That is hard to assess. But  
when we find we can't sell in the  
markets of the world we will have  
to do some thinking."  
George H. Baillie, Toronto, vice-  
president of Canadian Pacific  
Railway, also a vice-chairman of  
the chamber's executive council,  
told newspaper men:  
"Don't you think life is a mat-  
ter of trial and error every day?"  
"But I think we are proceeding  
along the right line when we are  
trying to enjoy our prosperity and  
still exercise some control."
