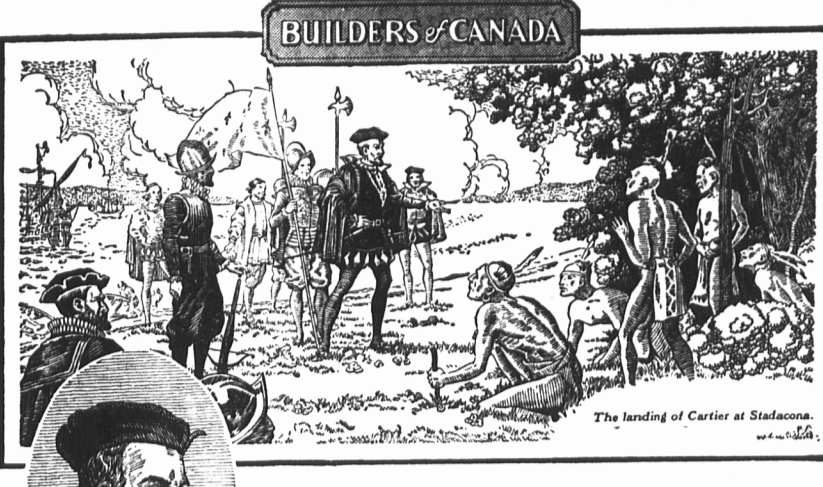
LONDON.—(CP)—Puzzle is a
