

### Mother, Son Die Of Burns

ST. JOHN'S, Nfld. (CP) — Mrs. Mary Lacey, 44, and a two-year-old twin boy died in hospital here Tuesday night, bringing to four the number of lives claimed in a fire which swept through the home of Ronald Lacey here early Monday.

The identity of the boy who died Tuesday night was not established. His twin brother died Monday along with Joan, 7. The twins were named Robert and Richard, but Mr. Lacey was unable to identify which child had been rescued from the burning house.

Two other children are still in hospital in critical condition. They are Loraine, nine, and Kevin, 10. They have not regained consciousness.

### Three Judges Appointed In Atlantic Area

OTTAWA (CP) — Appointment of three new judges in the Atlantic provinces has been announced by Justice Minister Favreau.

A Randolph Lusby, Amherst lawyer, was made judge of the County Court for Petron and Cumberland in Nova Scotia to replace Judge J. Welford Macdonald, who resigned.

The Newfoundland appointments are effective June 15, the Nova Scotia one Monday.

AMHERST (CP) — A new industry that will employ 50-60 people will be established here, it has been announced.

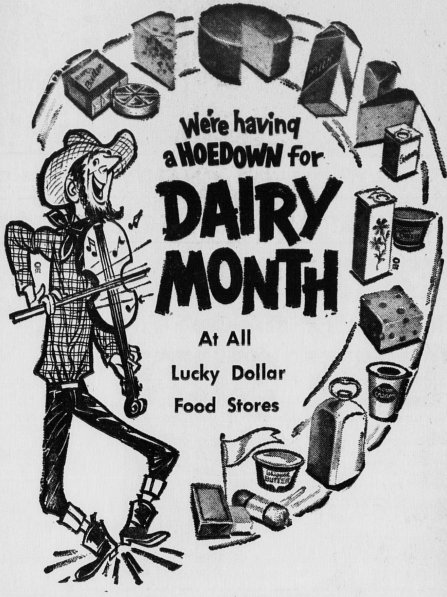
