A further rise of 7-8 to 1 cent a bushel was scored by wheat prices on Winnipeg grain exchange Saturday, as traders paid heed to deterioration reports from the south-west.

A SMALL OIL-CAN

In the midst of spring's annual campaign in the house it is not generally realized how useful a small oil-can will prove. Falling this a small tin oil and a good feather will do a lot of good work.

Wanted

Wanted: Keeping toes pointed forward separate legs about 18 inches. Swing body to the front and immediately swing back, each time relaxing the legs as much as possible. Keep arms over head, hands clasped together and swing them freely with the body. Repeat 16 times.

Do same exercise swinging body from side to side as far as possible. (Excellent for waist, thighs and hips.)

Nothing is so good for the legs as kicks but regular "battements" take too much control and develop muscles instead of stretching them. A much better method of kicking is to swing the leg instead of lifting it. Stand on right foot, right hand on bar, right foot turned out—swing left foot in two short counts: "front back and front" with a big free swing—then "back, front and back" with a big swing; so that the rhythm is one two three one

Stocks Hit Down Trend On Montreal

(C. P. By Guardian's Special Wire) MONTREAL, April 19—Steady liquidation, broken only by an occasional mild demand, depressed all but a few selected issues on a narrow Montreal Stock Exchange list Saturday. A couple of textiles, papers and constructions worked slightly higher, but losses of as much as five points were posted among the metals, utilities and banks.

Odd-lots of Smelters sent the price down five points after a loss of that much Friday. Nickel rallied somewhat after an early weak spell, but closed 1-4 lower, while Noranda lost 1-2.

Point-gain registered by International Paper preferred in the previous session was erased when the price dipped that much. Off fractionally were Montreal Power, Power Corporation and Brazilian. Late selling of Distillers Seagrams broke and the issue recorded a point-drop at 22. National Breweries common and preferred gave a little ground while Canadian Industrial Alcohol remained stationary.

Constructions found a little demand that brought fractional gains for Canada Cement, building products and Dominion Bridge, Foundation Company, however, received a minor set-back.

MINING

(Canadian Press) TORONTO, April 19—The mining section of Toronto exchange developed a mild decline in the closing session of the week with base metals leading the reverse action.

The group had made some headway in recent sessions and apparently was ripe for a little profit-taking. The miscellaneous index weakened about a point to 136.97 and the gold index .06 to 130.66. Volume crowded the 900,000 share mark.

Declines from a loss of 30 cents for Balmora there were no changes among the medium-price issues, exceeding 15 cents. Dome firmed 3-4 to 45 3-4, McIntyre added 3-8 while Pioneer and Teck Hughes weakened 5 cents each.

Falconbridge and Sudbury Basin declined 10 to 15 cents each and Noranda closed 1-4 down.
