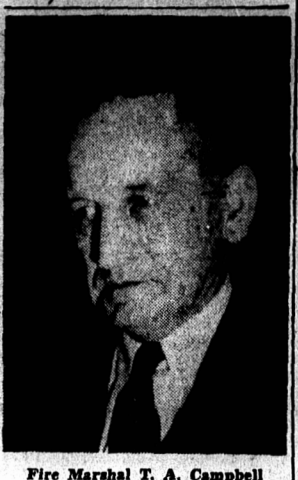

Two Lives Lost, And Over \$500,000 Fire Loss In Province Last Year

Fire damage amounting to \$588,017 and the deaths of two persons resulted from 269 fires in Prince Edward Island during 1949, according to a review issued by Provincial Fire Marshal T. A. Campbell on the eve of National Fire Prevention Week which begins tomorrow and ends Oct. 14. The Provincial Fire Marshal's office is now under the Department of Industry and Natural Resources, whose minister the Hon. Eugene Cullen is giving valuable assistance to the organization. Mr. Campbell has personally visited most of the larger centres at which time he has talked to the Fire Chiefs and other brigade personnel. He also visited a number of the schools and gave instructions on fire prevention and fire protection, and wishes to state that he met with wonderful co-operation from the people of the communities and the teachers.

The introduction of fire protection and fire prevention has been done with the co-operation of Hon. F. A. Large, Minister of Education and his Deputy, Dr. Shaw. By thus educating the children to eliminate fire hazards, it is hoped that the parents in the home will become more fire conscious. A booklet entitled "Standard Guide Book on Fire Prevention", approved by the Dominion Fire Prevention Association, the Association of Canadian Fire Marshals, and recommended by the Provincial Departments of Education, has been distributed to the teachers throughout the Province.

In the Province at the present time some 28 Fire Departments have been organized. These brigades are being trained in the most up-to-date methods of fire prevention and fire protection, and it is expected that the number of fires and the loss therefrom will be considerably lower in 1950 as a result of this training. The Fire Marshal is conducting a series of talks, round-table discussions throughout the different communities where a number of the leading citizens are called together. These talks deal with fire prevention, that is the elimination of all hazards, the proper conducting of small, country fire brigades, and the prompt reporting of all fire losses in the community by the different Fire Chiefs. The fact that the lighting of fires for the clearing up of lands, etc., is taken care of by the Fire Prevention Act of the Provincial Government is also brought to the attention of the meetings. He has also distributed "No smoking" placards, and the office of the Fire Marshal has on hand two fire prevention films which are being shown at the different theatres throughout the country.

Heavy Losses In 1949

Heavy Toll Taken In Fire Losses Annually

The following figures of fire losses incurred in Prince Edward Island during the years 1946-1949, furnished by the Provincial Fire Marshal, covers only the direct loss by flame, smoke and water. The indirect consequences are estimated to be six times as great. They represent an economic loss of six weeks' labour by the heads of every household annually:

The Fire Marshal's office has been instructed to fully co-operate with all municipal officials and others in responsible positions in eliminating fire hazards. Local Fire Chiefs are instructed to inspect theatres, hospitals, wholesale and retail stores, community halls and all places where an unusually large number of people congregate. Safety precautions include systematic tests of all school fire drills and fire equipment, and instructions to all students from Grade Six upwards.

This is the period when heating equipment is being readied for the long winter season. It is the time when there is an upward swing in chimney and heating equipment fires. All citizens are recommended to carefully examine their own situation in respect to safety.

FIRE PREVENTION WEEK 1950

By Royal Proclamation the week of October 8th to 14th, 1950, is proclaimed Fire Prevention Week for the whole of the nation.

Losses of life and property all over the nation continue at a heavy rate and co-operation between all Provincial and Municipal officials along with all citizens is an absolute necessity.

The Fire Marshal's Office has been instructed to fully co-operate with all Municipal officials and others in responsible positions and they will be fully occupied in this work before, during, and after Fire Prevention Week.

The local Fire Chiefs are also going to be active in informing all citizens of the havoc caused by fires that can be stopped before they start and they will advise how this can be effected.

Fire Chiefs are instructed to inspect Theatres, Hospitals, Wholesale and Retail stores, Community Halls and all places where an unusually large number of people congregate.

Fire Marshal staff and Fire Chiefs are instructed to carry out systematic tests of all School Fire Drills, to present their fire equipment organization to the teachers and the students and to also address all students from Grade Six and upwards.

This is the period when heating equipment is being readied for the long winter season. This is the time when there is an upward swing in Chimney and Heating Equipment fires. Citizens are recommended to carefully examine their own situation in respect to safety.

The Government of the Province of Prince Edward Island requests every responsible citizen to consider these grave facts and to fully co-operate in an active manner with all municipal authorities.
