HIGHER DUTIES WITH HIGHER PRICES.

The customs revenue for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1900, was \$28,374,148, an amount considerably in excess of the customs revenue for any previous year. For the year 1899 the amount was \$25,734,228, and in 1896 it was \$20,219,037. The highest amount of revenue obtained from customs in any year previous to 1899 was in the year 1890, when it amounted to \$24,014,908.

The increase in revenue since 1896 is largely due to the fact that higher prices are paid for almost all important articles.

The duties are now chiefly ad valorem and consequently as the prices rise the duties rise.

When the Liberals say that the duties are lower now than they were under the Conservative administration this fact must be taken into consideration, that while there was a slight reduction in the rate duties it has been more than offset in most cases by the rise in prices. If all the duties were specific they would remain the same no matter how much the prices increased, but the principle of ad valorem duties having been generally adopted, the tariff is actually higher on many articles than it was a few years ago, owing to the general increase of prices. Consequently most of our manufacturing industries have just as high protection now as they had in 1896 and some of them have more, but if a period of world-wide depression should come with falling prices, the duties being chiefly ad valorem, would decrease in amount at the time they would be most needed for the protection of home industries. Then the change that has been made in the Canadian tariff by the Laurier Government, although slight, would be felt by the manufacturers.—Star.

THE DANGEROUS PARTY.

the Pacific ocean of the Japan and China and Australian steamship lines, who inaugurated in Canada the Pacific cable scheme; and the movement for Imperial penny postage, and voted in Parliament for the sending of Canadian troops to share in the South African war. The Colonial Secretary has also commended his fears to the Ottawa ministers, and with his usual acumen chose Mr. Tarte, Mr Pacaud's old boodle partner, who struck the "no precedent" proviso into the order for sending the Canadian troops to South Africa, as a vehicle for making his views public. The whole plot glares out of the Tartean address.
