

Canada House In New York Sold To Fifth Avenue Group

NEW YORK (CP)—Canada House, a 26-story office building on Fifth Avenue conceived as a permanent centre of Canadian commercial and cultural interests in New York City, was sold Wednesday to the Fifth Avenue Corporation, a board chairman of Webb and Knapp, incorporated, announced the sale but did not disclose the price involved.

Canada House originally was conceived in 1953 by Hon. Ray Lawson, then consul general

for Canada in New York City. Mr. Lawson assembled a group of 27 Canadian business leaders, and each advanced \$100,000 to finance the building as a Canadian centre in New York.

MORE FUNDS NEEDED

Construction was started in 1956 on Fifth Avenue and 54th Street and unforeseen increases in building costs made it necessary to obtain additional financing. Webb and Knapp provided the additional investment in return for one-half interest in the building.

In December, 1960, two years after the building was completed and fully rented, the company sold its interest back to the original sponsors on a non-profit basis.

The building shares the block-front with fashionable St.

Soviet Editor Says Chinese Are Friendly

ROME (Reuters) — Alexei Adzhubei, son-in-law of Soviet Premier Khrushchev and editor of the Soviet government newspaper *Izvestia*, said Wednesday Russia has "magnificent and very friendly" relations with Communist China.

Adzhubei, 48 minutes late for a luncheon given him by foreign correspondents, told them the United States is a "country full of vanity" and complained that Americans think they could do

what they like.

"But tomorrow there will be a rude awakening and a great surprise," he said.

He was asked why so many Russians have been condemned to death in recent months for financial offences — something that has been abolished in democratic countries — and why so many of them were Jews.

CITES ROSENBERGS

Adzhubei replied that two Jews had been condemned to death in the United States, "one of them a pregnant woman — Rosenberg."

He was referring to the American traitors Julius and Ethel Rosenberg, electrocuted on June 30, 1953, for betraying atomic secrets to the Russians.

Adzhubei said he expected to

attend a special audience given today by Pope John XXIII.

Adzhubei also said it would be a good idea if the Vatican and the Soviet Union established diplomatic relations.

Questioned on when it would be possible to buy Western newspapers in Moscow, the Soviet editor said "when you finish writing dirty things about the Soviet Union."
