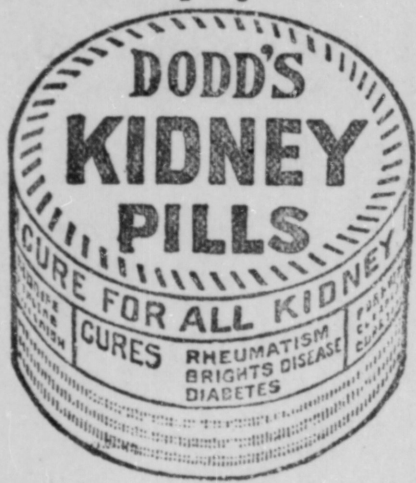

English Household Dont's. Don't put border on carpets for small rooms. Don't be chary of rich, warm tints in northern rooms. Don't hang chandeliers or lamps in low-ceiled rooms. Don't buy what suits the fancy, regardless of the combined effects. Don't select anything because it is fashionable, but because it is good. Don't have any apparent, much less any regular, arrangement of furniture. Don't believe for a minute that expensiveness is essential to beautiful effects. Don't make the table a pivot point from which the rest of the furniture radiates. Don't make a narrow door narrower with a heavy drapery. We drape too much. Don't have any fanciful, fixed arrangement of window draperies in rooms in daily use. Don't use decided patterns of upholstery if you have done so for wall and floor coverings.

The cellar is the most important part of the house to clean and keep clean. After all articles that may decay have been removed, burn sulphur in it. The fumes of this will destroy the germs of mold and decay, and make the place clean and sweet. Then see to it that good ventilation is given. In hot weather open the windows at night and close them in day. The reason for this is that the night air, being much cooler than the day air, is kept in to reduce the temperature through the hot summer's day.

To keep the refrigerator free from food odors, place in it a saucer half-filled with powdered charcoal, renewing it once a week.

A Mother's Advice to Mothers.

Keep your children busy at some wholesome work or play, and this is more to the young mind than long homilies on vice, which only tend to direct their attention constantly to it. By occupying their time every minute of the day they will be more thoroughly helped and cleansed than would be possible in any other manner.

The majority of parents do not realize the importance of the duty laid upon them or else they are too lazy or incapable to attend to it.

The first duty of the rich is to be industrious and to inculcate habits of industry in their children. If they are taught to keep constantly busy in some useful and ennobling employment, the chances of their evolution into honorable men and women are a million times increased.

The making of collections and the hard study of almost any branch of natural history are likely to interest children. The making of machines, the intricacies of music, the management of a printing press, are all useful in keeping the young mind occupied in a wholesome and healthy manner.

Frightening Children

Nothing can be worse for a child than to be frightened. The effect of the scare it is slow to recover from. It remains sometimes until maturity, as is shown by many instances of morbid sensitiveness and excessive nervousness. Not infrequently fear is employed as a means of discipline. Children are controlled by being made to believe that

something terrible will happen to them and punished by being shut up in dark rooms or by being put in places they stand in dread of. No one without vivid memory of his childhood can comprehend how entirely cruel such things are. We have often heard grown persons tell of the suffering they have endured as children under like circumstances and recount the irreparable injury which they are sure they then received. No parent, no nurse, capable of alarming the young is fitted for her position.

Children as near as possible, should be trained not to know the sense of fear which above everything else, is to be feared in their education early and late. Some interesting facts dealing with the fears of children have been collected by a well known professor. He found that 1,701 children were afraid of 9,456 things. The leading fears were lightning and thunder, reptiles, strangers, the dark, death, domestic animals, water, ghosts, insects, rats and mice and high words. Some of the fears were the results of personal experiences—that is, in a district where a great wind had wrought a havoc the children were afraid of it. In other cases the analysis showed by what means parents had worked upon the imaginations of their children. In one district 16 poor little ones were dreading the end of the world. The most gratifying fact of all was that one child had been frightened into obedience or good conduct by the fear of the devil. A century or two ago that fear would have led all the rest. The pleasing inference is that parents now dwell upon affection and love to insure the goodness of their children instead of terrorizing them with satan's wrath. —Philadelphia Press.
