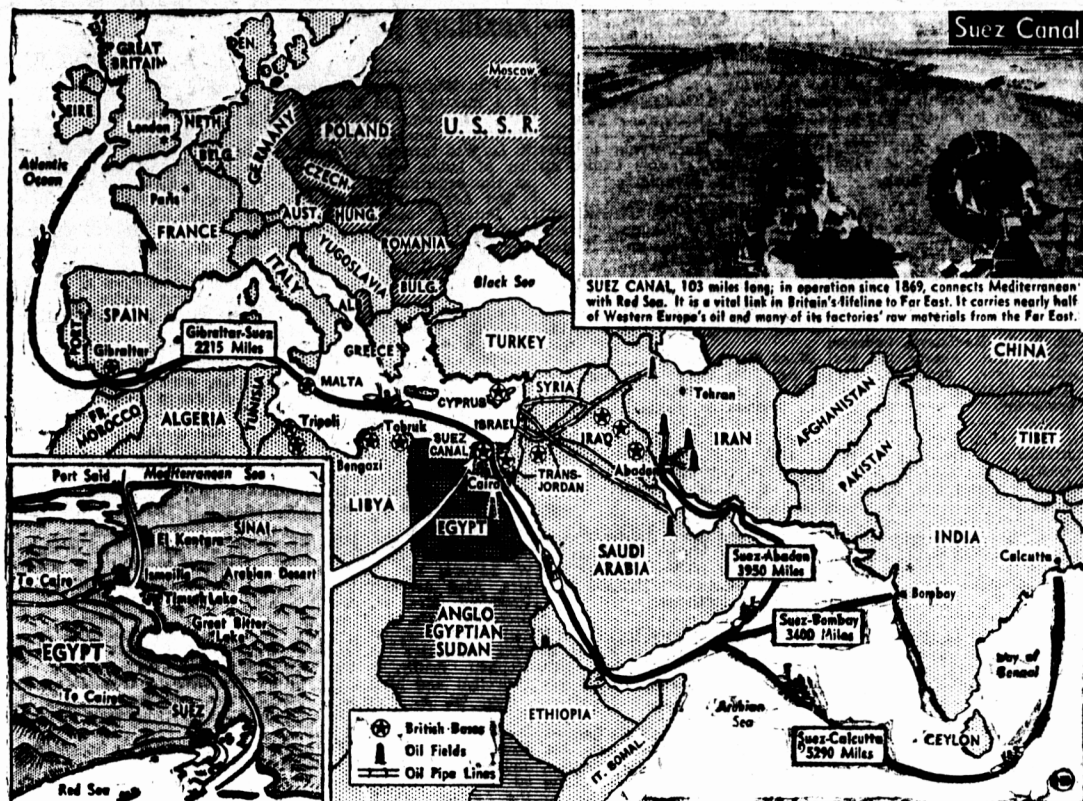

WINNIPEG, Oct. 15 — (CP) — Unfavorable harvest weather stimulated aggressive buying today on the Winnipeg Grain Exchange, and prices generally moved up for good gains. A maximum advance of 15 cents was recorded in October flax, while new seasonal highs were reached in December and May oats, October, December and May barley, and December and May flax. Shippers and other interests picked up oats and barley, where offerings were light in proportion to the demand. American houses were active buyers in all grains during the active trade. Forecasts of continuous snow in some areas of Alberta and Saskatchewan was a major factor in the trade. Export loadings of Canadian wheat were confined to 200,000 bushels to the United Kingdom. Prices for class two wheat and I.W.A. were unchanged. Closing prices: Oats — Oct. 93½B, Dec. 92¼A, May 92½, July X-89½nnt. Barley — Oct. 1.40, Dec. 1.30½B, May 1.26¾, July 1.22¾B. Egypt's Squeeze On Suez Jolts Britain And The West



SUEZ CANAL, 103 miles long, in operation since 1869, connects Mediterranean with Red Sea. It is a vital link in Britain's lifeline to Far East. It carries nearly half of Western Europe's oil and many of its factories' raw materials from the Far East.

The fate of the Western world's largest, best supplied and most strategically placed military bastion in the stormy Middle East is involved in the grave dispute between Britain and Egypt. Egypt's hasty moves to cancel a 1936 treaty that allows British troops in the Suez and the 1899 agreements under which the Sudan is jointly administered by Britain and Egypt come as a severe blow following hard upon Britain's forced withdrawal from Iran. The Newsmag above shows strategic importance of the Suez Canal, considered the keystone of Western defense of the Mediterranean. Cairo's moves to eject British troops from Suez came as Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower met with U.S. French and British chiefs of staff in Paris to rush plans for a Middle East defense system with Turkey and Egypt as primary bases.
