ANGINA (PAIN IN CHEST) OF EFFORT AND OF REST

Q. Is it ever correct to send formal invitations in the first person?

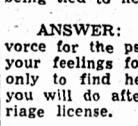
A. No; formal invitations are always written in the third person.

HONEY LEMONADE Quarter cup fresh lemon juice, 1/4 cup honey, 4 cups water. Combine lemon juice with the honey and stir well.

A. Stitch a piece of tape to the material, turn the hem up on the wrong side, and stitch the tape to the material. It will make a much neater job, as it avoids the necessity of folding the material twice.
