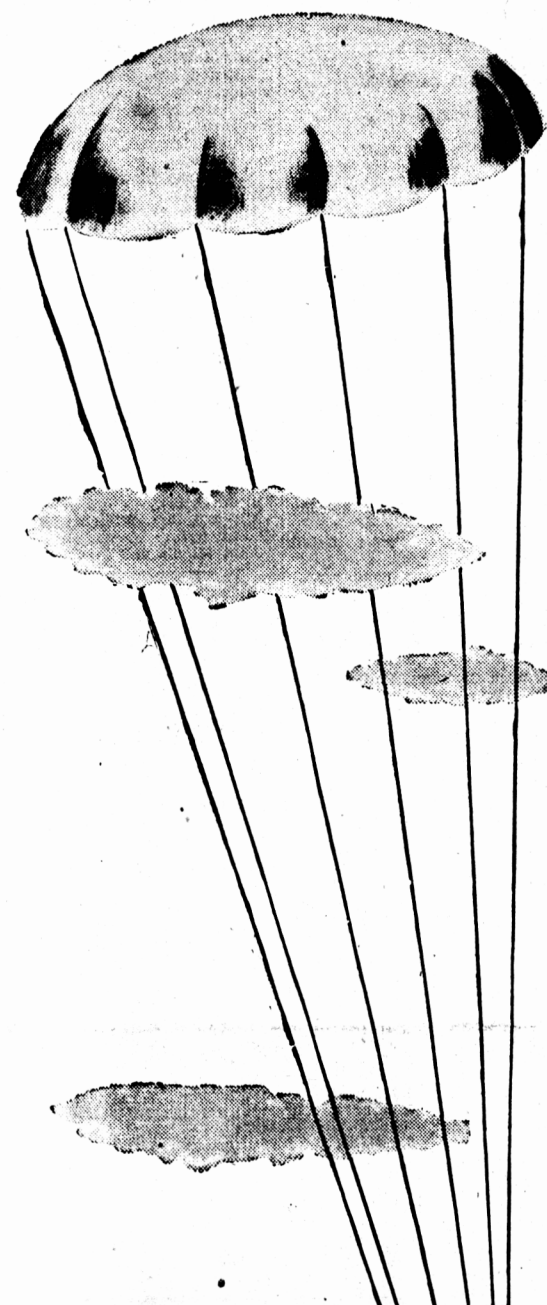

And it is the large number of moderate drinkers who form the greatest basis of its support. Granted that they themselves suffer no apparent ill or damage in any way, drinking cautiously and judiciously, the fact remains none the less that they can in no way dissociate demoralization caused by the sale and use of alcohol. They are a part of the disease and not the cure; they are a part of the problem and not its answer. They are the ones who vote for the liquor stores, they make their purchases - maybe small ones - and they contribute toward the upkeep of the total traffic and evil.

MODERATE DRINKING A BAD EXAMPLE

In the second place there is the matter of example and influence. Much as we might like to live in a world where we can do as we please and it is "nobody's business," we just don't live in that sort of a world. Our lives are socially conditioned. We are all influenced in thought and action by the habits and customs of others. Whether we would have it so or not is the old question, "Am I my Brother's Keeper?" comes up with an affirmative answer that we cannot evade. And it is precisely this social custom and imitation of the habits of others that is the occasion of so much thoughtless drinking. It is not the need of drink or the desire to drink but the social pressure that drives countless thousands into this undesirable habit. Let any man face up to his responsibility along this line and see the "Sin of Drinking" and the involvement of others.

For many years now we have been stressing the need of education in our campaign against drink. We have clamored for the latest scientific information as to the physiological, the social, the psychological, the economic, etc., results of drinking. We have accumulated a great amount of reliable data that can be of great use in the campaign against this great evil. But until we see this whole concern as something that is an offence to God, something that is positively evil because of what it does to men and women and human society; until we see it in its true Moral Nature, we have not yet summoned our strongest weapon. The time has come for the leaders of the Christian Church to do some very deep and clear thinking on the problem; to do some very plain and loud talking about it, and to proclaim to thousands of complacent moderate drinkers in church pews that drinking "IS A SIN" because of what it does to human beings, to God's children. Hence, it is contrary to the WILL OF GOD.

beside it." "If you Yanks had been just a little smarter, if you hadn't alternately bullied, wooed and ignored us, if you had ever stopped to understand us, we would have joined you long ago. That is the first trouble with you Yanks. You don't understand anybody, not even your closest friend across the river." This lack of understanding of others and the assumption that the American way of life "is the basic norm of human behavior," is now the greatest source of your weakness as the established leader of the world.

The U. S. is "in danger of becoming the most powerful and

most unpopular nation in the world outside Russia... and mainly because, in a desperate search for popularity, you have done everything except to recognize that other peoples are not potential, underdeveloped Yanks..." "Expecting too much, and fiercely pursuing it," Hutchison writes, "you Yanks have lost the free and simple gift of contentment on the way."

"The trouble, in short," he says, "is that you Yanks haven't turned out as you or anybody else expected... everybody has baffled you because he stubbornly refused to be a Yank. The confusion will continue until... the world is convinced at last that you have grown into your massive breeches."

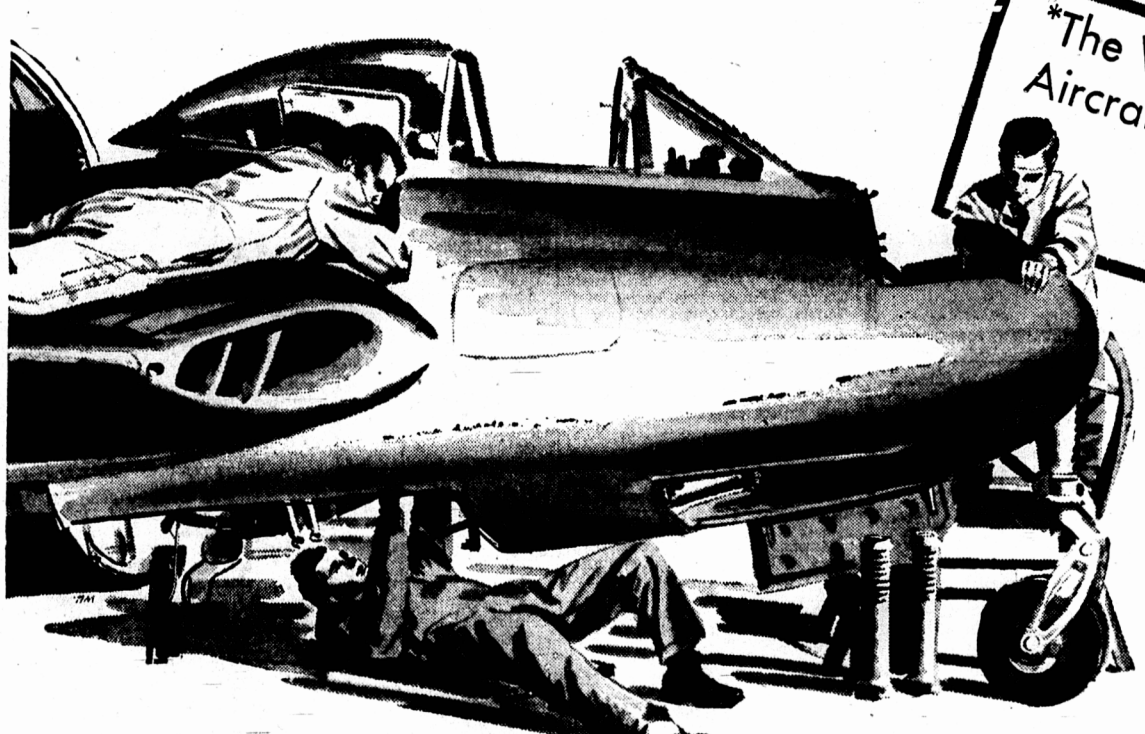
