A long discussion regarding speed limits under the Highway Traffic Act was touched off yesterday when an amendment to the Act was introduced in the Legislature.

Section 36 of the Act states that anyone driving a vehicle at a greater speed than 30 miles per hour when meeting a vehicle at night, or more than 50 miles per hour at any time, shall conclusively be deemed to be driving without due care and attention.
