sure before operation, blood transfusions or drugs were given to raise the blood pressure. In two patients mydriasis (dilated pupils) persisted for two or three hours after operation although the blood pressure had returned to its pre-operation level and the general condition was good.

While in 28 out of 31 cases the blood pressure was reduced to enable the surgeon to operate safely, the fact that in three cases the hexamethonium failed to reduce the high blood pressure must be remembered. Failure of this drug to reduce the blood pressure during operation may be due to the fact that it may not be acted on by the kidneys and is thus thrown out of the body unchanged by the kidneys. This is reported by Dr. B. Goldstone in South African Medical Journal. The kidneys become blocked and urine backs up instead of being removed by the body. From this we learn that in operations where reduction of blood pressure is necessary or desirable, the action of the kidneys should first be investigated.
