participation in such a plan. Full rebates will be made up to 30 September... after that date rebates must be pro-rated. Those students who come from provinces where a premium is charged should ensure that these payments are maintained. It must be emphasized that our insurance, Zurich, applies, for Canadian students, only for charges ABOVE those which are paid by Provincial plans. ation you may require. Eye glasses and dental care are NOT covered except when accidental damage is done to NATURAL teeth.

For Foreign students who have Landed Immigrant status the charge is the same as for Canadians. Foreign students, who do not come under Medicare, receive a great deal more protection from this plan than do Canadians and this accounts for the

difference in rates. If there is any doubt about your status, i.e. if you are neither a Canadian nor a Landed Immigrant and have been charged the Canadian rate you should visit the Student Union Office immediately for a clarification. Conversely, if you do come under a provincial plan and have been charged as a foreign student you might be eligible for a rebate.
