Boston Red Sox Sign New Pitcher

BOSTON, July 2 — (AP) — Boston Red Sox today signed Phil Marchildon, former Philadelphia Athletics pitcher, as a relief pitcher.

Marchildon was released June 5 by Buffalo of the International League and became a free agent. An R.C.A.F. veteran, he was a prisoner of war and has never regained his old form since.

The hurler, a native of Penetanguishene, Ont., appeared in five games for the Bisons and was charged with as many losses. Acquisition of Marchildon extended the Red Sox roster to the 25-player limit.
