

PEI Members Urge Claims Of Credit Unions Under New Fishermen's Loans

OTTAWA, June 9.—(Special)—T. J. Kichham, Liberal MP for King's, mentioned today that he had been omitted from the report of the House of Commons debate earlier this week on federal loans to fishermen. At the evening session, Mr. Kichham congratulated Fisheries Minister Sinclair and the Government on the new policy of arranging loans for fishermen on a basis somewhat similar to those under the Farm Improvement Loans Act.

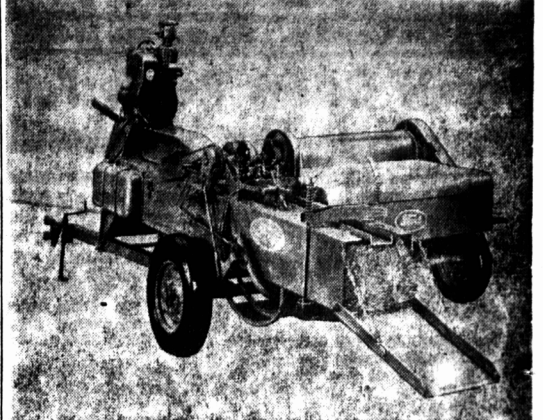
The president expressed her regret that the educational convener was absent owing to illness and hoped for her speedy recovery.
