

Fishermen Discuss Plans At Murray Hbr. Meeting

Mr. Charles Richards, provincial secretary of the P.E.I. Fishermen's Association, presided at the meeting held in Murray Harbour last night. Mr. Richards, prior to introducing the speakers, spoke briefly suggesting a stronger organization through increased membership. Pointing to the amalgamation of the Mont Carmel and Egmont Bay locals, he suggested that this idea should be carried out throughout the Province so as to make the association sufficiently strong to compete for markets. He suggested that with the present 8-dragger fleet in Murray Har-

bour, and a large number of in-shore boats, the fishermen should consider the establishing of a fillet-plant in the area. Mr. Uric Forrier, manager of the Mont Carmel and Egmont Bay local, explained the difficulties in forming the merger, and its success since its formation. He stated that the local had done a \$300,000.00 business with lobsters, herring and mackerel, and stressed the increased returns to the fishermen through the operation of their own factory. It was regrettable, he said, that local factories had to contend with mainland buyers, but he felt

that through co-operative endeavor this difficulty might be overcome. Rev. William Simpson, of the Extension Department of St. Dunstan's University, noted the great changes in the methods of fishing during the past several years, and said that fishermen must keep up with the changes. Organization would provide stability, he said, and the fishermen must organize to a greater degree in order to meet competition. Mr. Frank Campbell of the Loan Board also spoke of the need for greater organization among fishermen. He felt that since it was the fishermen who had the boats, they would thus in great measure control the production, and through their own factories could also control in greater degree their own marketing to get greater returns for themselves. Several interesting films on fishing were shown during the evening, and the meeting concluded with a vote of thanks to the speakers.
