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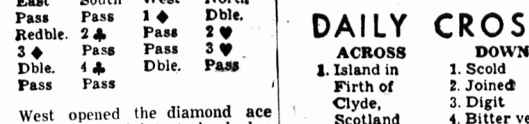

DETROIT, (AP)—Rocks, clubs and fists flew Sunday in Michigan's week-old milk strike as striking dairy farmers battled non-striking producers in an attempt to throttle supply lines and force creameries to meet their price demands.
State police were sent to tiny Elsie and Ovid, about 100 miles northwest of Detroit, where Sheriff Percy J. Patterson of Clinton county reported he was unable to cope with growing violence at milk collection depots.
