Of Special Interest to our Farmers

Clover.

Scarcely an institute is held that some one does not show the great value of clover, and we with many others, can not but wonder why this valuable plant does not receive universal attention. There is nothing grown on the farm that possesses more value, and it can be fed profitably to every animal on the farm and at any stage in the life of the animal. Not long since some agricultural journal stated that clover hay could not safely be fed to idle horses. Why not? It contains the very element that should be fed to the horse whether at work or idle. The writer who made the statement reached a conclusion from faulty premises. Properly cured clover hay will hurt no animal. It is one of the best things in the world to feed to hogs and may be fed either dry or steamed but preferably steamed. For cows it is ideal. Fed in connection with corn meal it has been shown by practical feeders to be the best and cheapest food for the fattening animal, its character or composition counteracting the bad effects of the fattening process. At an institute this winter a feeder stated that he had never made more or cheaper beef than by feeding clover hay and cornmeal.

As a soil renovator its value is well known, and the soil throughout this entire West needs a good deal more attention than it is receiving. We have been farming our land to death and if the need of greater precaution and fertilizing was suggested the farmers of the prairies poohed it as nonsense; and as a result our wheat belt has been steadily moving westward and we are growing aridiculous by small average corn crop. But the inevitable result of continuously robbing the soil has come to some of our most splendidly fertile sections, and those who would not listen are compelled to see. All through the older West we now have practically exhausted farms, and only two things remain to be done in such cases: either move further west or adopt some sensible system of bringing up the disorganized or impoverished land. Which shall we do? Most people will adopt the latter, for most people who live on such farms have been forced to see that scientific agriculture is a good deal more profitable than moving to some other place where the same ruinous system will produce the very same results. To the owners of these run down farms nothing can be suggested that will be of greater utility in restoring the fertility of the land than the sowing of clover, even if nothing but the roots are left to the soil.—Agricultural Epitomist.

Neatness About the House.

reckless extravagance not to paint when paint is needed or not to drive a nail when a board on a building has become loose or a picket has fallen from the fence. To neglect necessary repairs is to permit a leak on the farm and in the pocket book. Leaving appearances out of the question entirely—and it is the duty of the farmer to make himself and his farm to appear as well as possible—neatness as represented by paint and good buildings and fences, it is a simple principle of good business management, for any other condition indicates decay and loss. A rotten board or loose one on a building admits dampness to the structure and pretty soon there will be more rotten boards or more loose ones. Broken down fences are a temptation to stock to become breachy, and expose crops to the danger of being injured by cattle and horses. To permit such things is not the way that the careful business men make a success of their business. They achieve success by attention to the smallest detail and by keeping their establishment, in every part, up to a high standard of condition.
