I know this last month of classes will be busy for you, but it could be to your advantage to drop by Student Services And check into Sources of Financial Aid.

If you intend to go to university this fall, you should see if you might be eligible for any scholarships or bursaries. It never hurts to plan ahead! Below are a few which might be of interest to you.

Helen Herring Scholarship

\$500. awarded to a student from PEI, who, by September, is enrolled in the final year of a university program leading to a degree in Home Economics.

Deadline: April 30
Italian Government Scholarships

Scholarships for Canadian students for enrollment in Italian Universities or for individual studies in Italy.

Tenable during the academic year from November 1 to October 31, 1983, and may be awarded for periods of 1 to 9 months.

Deadlines: March 31, January 9, 1983.

S.R.Laycock Bursary

\$500. annually for graduate studies in Health Education in Canada or elsewhere.

Deadline: April 30

Evelyn M. Cudmore Scholarship

This scholarship is valued at approximately \$1,000 and was organized and set up by Red Cross Volunteer workers in recognition of the great contributions Evelyn M. Cudmore has made to the quality of life in Prince Edward Island. Mrs. Cudmore, a tireless worker, a great lover of mankind, made her greatest contributions in the area of prevention of disease, promotion of education, human growth, and development.

Eligibility: To be eligible to receive the

Evelyn M. Cudmore Scholarship students must meet the following criteria.

- a) be an Island resident
- b) have been trained as a Red Cross water safety instructor by the Canadian Red Cross, PEI Division, and have worked as a Red Cross water safety instructor in Prince Edward Island under the direction of the Canadian Red Cross, PEI Division. The term water safety instructor shall be construed to include smallcraft safety instructors.
- c) if an undergraduate student the applicant must be enrolled at the University of Prince Edward Island during the year for which the scholarship is to be presented.
- d) if a post graduate student, the applicant must be enrolled in a Canadian university during the year for which the scholarship is to be presented.

Selection Criteria

The Evelyn M. Cudmore Selection Committee will award the scholarship to the applicant who best demonstrates the following: outstanding leadership ability, capacity to accept responsibility, thoroughness and dedication in completing assigned tasks as evidenced by the applicant's performance while working with the Red Cross., PEI Division in any part of its aquatic programs; sound academic performance; personal integrity; physical vigor, and enthusiasm as shown by the fondness or success in outdoor activities.

Application Deadline

Student should apply no later than May 1. Applications may be received by writing the Evelyn M. Cudmore Scholarship Committee, 62 Prince Street, Charlottetown PEI. Phone 894-8551.

The scholarship committee hopes to announce the winner of the scholarship around mid May and award the scholarship about the middle of September.
