THE QUEEN'S SPEECH. THE GREEK-TURKISH WAR. THE DEBILITATING EFFECTS OF JUSTICE GROWS DULLER.

The following is the Queen's Speech, delivered on the opening of Parliament on the 6th: My Lords and Gentlemen, I have called you to a period of rest...

My relations with foreign powers continue to be friendly and harmonious. The main question, relating to the frontier between Turkey and Montenegro, has been settled.

A rising in the Transvaal has recently imposed on me the duty of taking military measures with a view to the restoration of peace.

The war in Afghanistan has been brought to a close, and, with the exception of the Candahar force, my troops have been recalled within the India frontier.

DUBLIN, Jan. 3. Last night some people near Claremont dug a ditch across the road to prevent the passage of process-servers, who, with a police court, were proceeding to serve writs of ejectment.

The War in South America is beginning to have a very serious aspect for the people of Peru. A telegram just received from Panama states that on the 23rd December the Chilean forces within twenty miles of Lima, the Peruvian Capital. The Chileans have the command of the sea and, with the aid of their land forces will be able to cut off all supplies, so it is clear that unless the Peruvian army is able to make a stand, the Chilean force, Lima must fall, from want of food, if from no other cause.

The Mayor of Athens telegraphs to the Lord Mayor of London that a magnificent and complete statue of Minerva Victorious, the gift of the Emperor of Russia, has just been discovered.

Sir Rutherford Alcock is not insensible to Colonel Gordon's opinion that the force of China is immense if wisely directed. He deprecates that Russia should obtain a footing in Pekin.

Four new French iron-clads are about to be put on the stocks, and will be named the Hoche, Mareau, Neptune, and Magenta. They are all from the same design and of the same armament.
