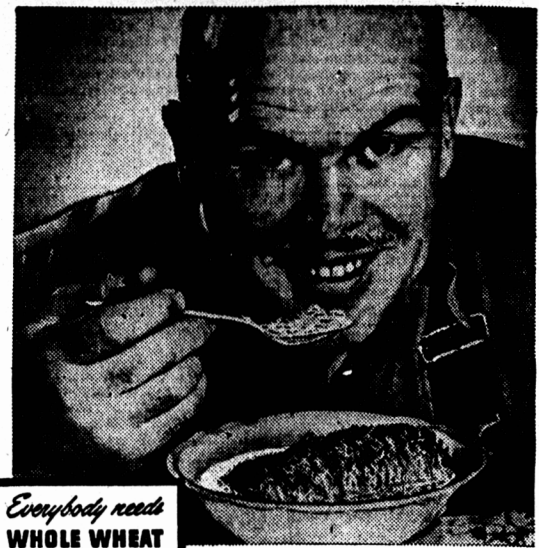

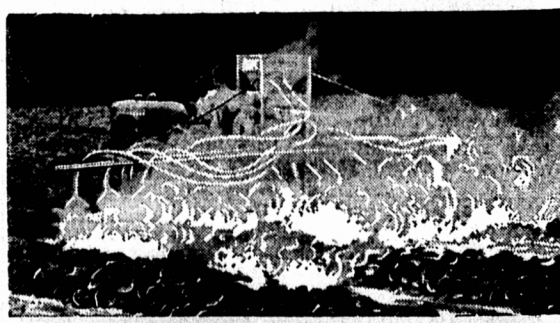

of different personalities in one man! He was neither proud, selfish nor domineering and he often dimmed his own glory in order that some lesser artist might shine forth. On one occasion he actually removed one of his own pictures from the Academy to make room for an unknown artist's work. The wandering life that he led

in his younger years suited his fancy. It helped to keep him isolated and unknown. How he looked to other men did not bother him in the least. Nor did he care how other men looked everyone to his fancy. He lived as it pleased him and he thought everyone should follow the path his fancy dictated. Once he became known in a district he moved on to some other place. It was the same in his home city, an almost ceaseless shifting from one lodging to another. Finally when old age caught up with him he sought out

a private room where he could be alone. When his landlady asked for a reference he showed some bank notes under her nose. Persons in the neighborhood generally referred to the newcomer as the "Admiral". His real name they never learned until after he had passed away. In that same lonely room the end came one night in 1861, when the famous and wealthy artist was seventy-five. He left his entire fortune to found a home for down-and-out artists, but due to some mis-worded clause in his

will, his money passed into the hands of his cousins. His great paintings and drawings were bequeathed to the Nation on one condition, namely that they be kept together in a "Turner room". So it came about that Joseph Turner's name, while hidden in his lifetime, should be known after his death. A strange story indeed.

**GIANT SUGAR MILL**  
KARACHI — (CP) — The largest sugar mill in Asia, situated in the Mardan district of Pakistan will go into production in November. The mill took four years to complete and has a crushing capacity of more than 3,000 tons of cane daily which will yield about 350 tons of fine sugar.
