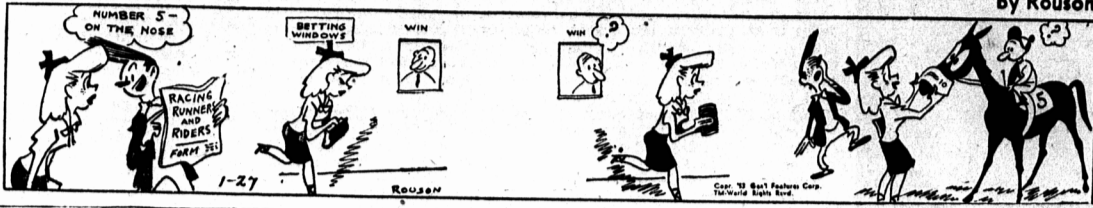

Come From Behind To Down Millionaires 3-2; Five Points From Halifax

Murph Chamberlain's Islanders maintained their sizzling drive towards top spot in the Maritime Major Hockey League here last night by coming from behind to shade Sydney Millionaires 3-2 in a well and bitterly played game at the Forum.

The Islanders fought back from under a 2-0 Sydney lead at the end of the first period. They tied the game at 2-2 during the second session and shot the only counter of a lively third session.

Once more it was the vaunted right wing scoring power of the Islanders that paid off. Cager Lyle Wiseman fired two goals in the second period and Ronnie "Little Murph" Hurst came through with the winner in the third.

As a result of the game the Islanders move to within five points of the first place Halifax Atlantics. The locals have been undefeated in their last six games and have lost only two of their last sixteen contests.

The Millionaires skated onto the ice last night without having won a game in Charlottetown this season and for sixty minutes they gave their best effort of the year as they strove to beat the Islanders jinx.

And they almost succeeded in tipping the apple cart. Several times in the final period they rode in on Al Millar but were outgassed by the Islanders netminder.

The Mills raced into an early 2-0 lead on goals by Freddy Hildebrand and Bill McDonagh. Hildebrand, who played an outstanding game, broke away to scoop up Alex Birukov's forward pass and beat Al Millar on a 20-foot shot. Millar got his pads on the puck but the disc trickled into the corner of the cage.

Late in the same period opportunist Bill McDonagh intercepted a pass-out inside the Islanders blue line. He stuck around one defenseman and fired the puck into an empty net as Al Millar came out to meet him.

The ended the scoring for Sydney. Pidsodny and Holdaway line, turned on the pressure in the second period in a desperate effort to get back in the game.

They clicked at the 5:54 mark of the game with right winger Wiseman reefing a searing shot behind the Pidsodny net. The young Chuck Holdaway made assist on the goal which was made possible through a rush by defenseman Gus Gustavson.

Big Gus steamed into the Sydney end knocking Bill McDonagh sprawling along the way. He got the puck back to Holdaway who passed to Wiseman. The latter stickhandled past George Robertson and blasted the black biscuit into the webbing.

The players set a fast pace around the midway mark as tempers rose near the breaking point.

Wiseman knotted the count at the 12:36 mark with a smart goal. He picked up the puck inside the Sydney line deked two defencemen and flipped a shot from 35 feet out that landed in the corrdage before Pidsodny got his eye on the disc. The shot was screened by a Sydney player and Nick had no chance on the shot.

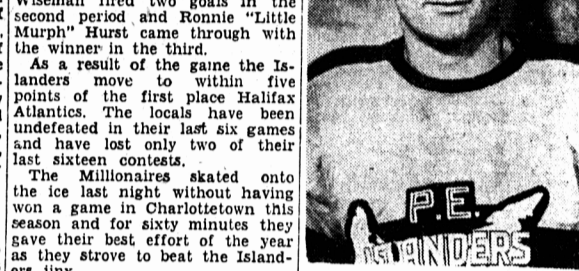
The Millionaires roared back late in the period and had two great scoring chances. Eddy Marineau set up Freddy Hildebrand about a minute later Alex Birukov had a goal-mouth opportunity to score but Millar rose to the occasion each time.

Eddy Marineau of Sydney drew the first penalty of the game early in the third period for holding Walter Pawlshyn. While he was off the Islanders had several good chances but could not beat Pidsodny.

Gus Gustavson almost scored the winner for the Islanders at the seven minute mark. He took a pass from Teddy Powers and his 30 foot shot hit the goal post. It was the second time that an Islander struck the post, Hub Beaudry did the same thing early in the second period.
