

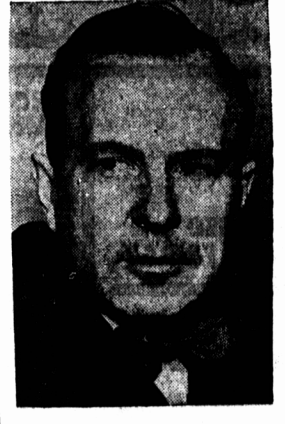
City Council Recommends One High School Sufficient

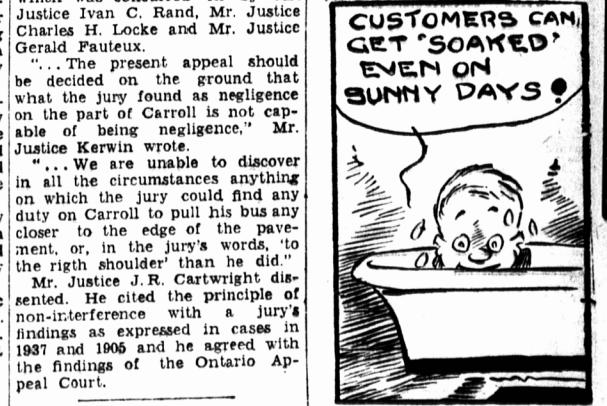
