Notice to Commercial Travellers.
The attention of Commercial Travellers is called to the following sections of an Act passed by the Legislative Assembly of Prince Edward Island, Session 1893-4, entitled "An Act to Impose a Direct Tax on Certain Classes of Travellers."
"From and after the passing of this Act every casual trader and permanently residing in this Province doing business within the Province, commonly known as 'commercial travellers,' and every person who permanently resides in this Province, and who either for himself or any other person, or solicits or canvasses for orders either for himself or any other person for the sale, exchange or purchase of any goods, wares or merchandise in any manner whatsoever, or the production of samples, catalogues, circulars, printed or written matter, or any by word of mouth without the production of samples, photographs, catalogues, printed or written matter, or any upon the business of so selling any goods, wares or merchandise, or advertising or canvassing for such orders, pay to the Provincial Treasurer an annual tax of five dollars, or direct tax of five dollars if he is not a resident of this Province, and if he is a resident of this Province, he shall grant a license authorizing the person therein named to sell goods, wares and merchandise in this Province, and to solicit and canvass for orders for the sale, exchange or purchase of any goods, wares or merchandise, or the production of samples, photographs, catalogues, printed or written matter, or any upon the business of so selling any goods, wares or merchandise, or advertising or canvassing for such orders, pay to the Provincial Treasurer."
"By such Comm. retail Traveller or person not permanently residing within this Province as aforesaid, who, after the passing of this Act, shall sell any goods, wares or merchandise, or solicit or canvass for orders for the sale, exchange or purchase of any goods, wares or merchandise, or the production of samples, photographs, catalogues, printed or written matter, or any upon the business of so selling any goods, wares or merchandise, or advertising or canvassing for such orders, pay to the Provincial Treasurer."
This Act is now in force.
Licenses can be procured in Charlottetown at the Provincial Treasury, in Summerside from Wm. T. Hartman, in Georgetown from George B. Allen Esq.
