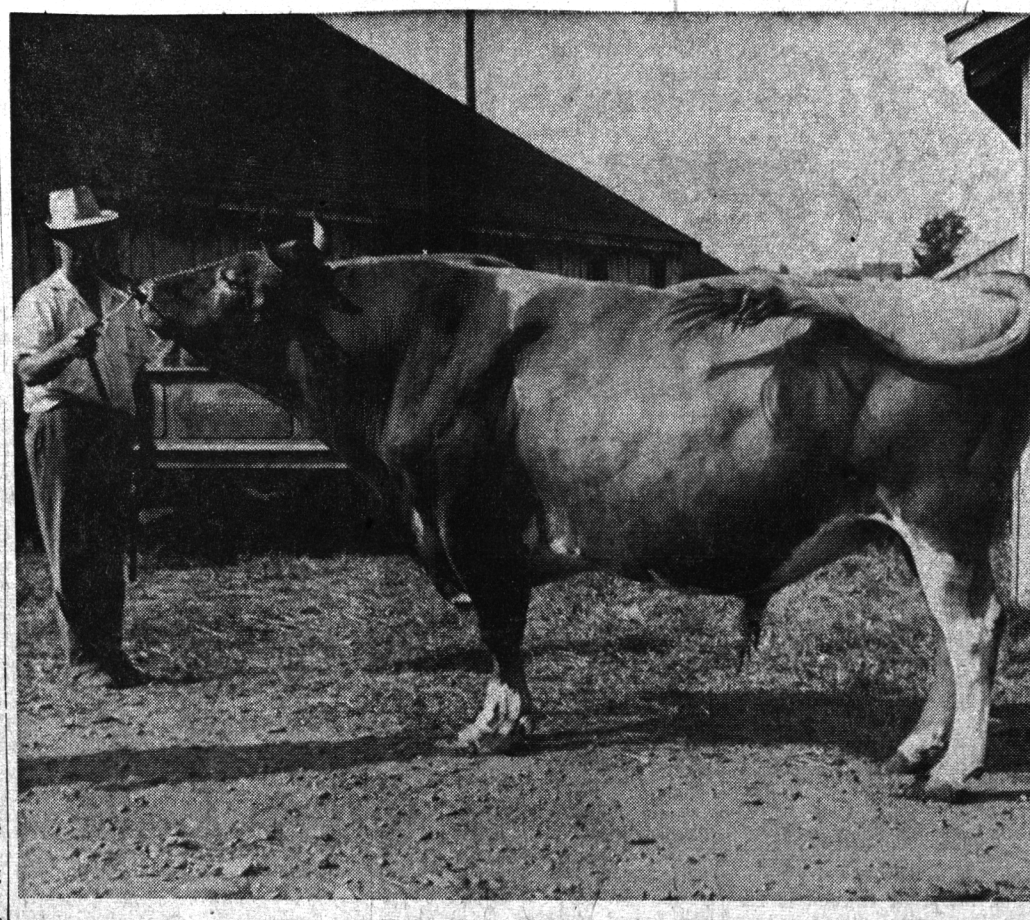


**A REAL CHAMPION**

would be in a less favorable competitive position in the Maritimes than Atlantic Sugar enjoys in Ontario and Quebec, where it sells 70 per cent of its output. Freight rates designed to favor the Maritimes often allowed refined sugar to be shipped from Saint John to Ontario points for less than it could be shipped from Montreal. An example was the rate for Windsor, Ont.: Sugar could be shipped from Saint John to Windsor, 1,033 miles, for 60 cents a hundredweight. From Montreal to Windsor, 562 miles, cost 62 cents a hundredweight. Saint John could ship to Montreal for 24 cents, Montreal to Saint John for 30 cents. He said Maritime food companies that are big consumers of sugar were fearful they might flounder if local sources of sugar dried up — if Acadia-Atlantic moved away. "Our company will absorb part of the freight costs in excess of those paid by Atlantic Sugar, and we will offer a second source of supply to the Maritimes at competitive prices," he said. **BUY IN WEST INDIES** Mr. Davidson said the British Caribbean's imports of Maritime fish represented the area's second-best market for the fishing industry. His company's policy was to buy much of its raw sugar from the West Indies in order to give the islands increased purchasing power for buying Maritime fish and other Canadian goods. He said Canada's protective trade agreement with the British West Indies allows sugar into Canada with a 29-cent tariff on 100 pounds. The tariff on unprotected sugar from Cuba was \$1.29. Raw sugar was landed in Canada, duty paid, for about \$5.00 per 100 pounds. West Indian sugar sold in Canada for about 15 to 30 cents less than that from Cuba. He said Cuba's trade policies favored the United States. Reduction of tariffs on raw sugar from non-Commonwealth sources, advocated by the Atlantic Provinces Economic Council as a means of keeping Atlantic Sugar in its Saint John plant, would

MONTREAL (CP)—A top executive of the Canada and Dominion Sugar Company Limited of Chatham, Ont., said Friday the company plans increased activity in the Maritimes because "we'd just like to be represented down there, that's all." Administrative secretary M. W. Davidson scoffed at reports that his company planned to try to sell more sugar in the Maritimes in retaliation for threats by Acadia-Atlantic Sugar Refineries Limited to move its refining operations from Saint John, N.B., to Ontario. Mr. Davidson was interviewed in Montreal fresh from a two-week trip to Nova Scotia and New Brunswick to explain his company's position. The company had sold its complete line


