Comission Continues Hearings in Newfoundland

(CP) — A three-man royal commission investigating this province's economic progress since Confederation was told Tuesday residents of Canada's three Maritime provinces are "twice as well off" as Newfoundlanders when it comes to modern conveniences. In presenting the province's case for an upward revision of the financial terms of union, special adviser Carl Goldenberg of Montreal said you can find isolated homes in New Brunswick that lack proper sanitation facilities but not a whole village. He said Lower Battery, clinging to the side of a steep hill at the harbor mouth here, was such a village. It was "a crowded community of houses which have sprung up together, climbing out of one another's back yards. . . . Here the slops from one house flow within two feet of the back door of the next. . . . Mainlanders are twice as well off in respect to conveniences such as hot and cold running water, flush toilets, telephones, vacuum cleaners and so on." COST OF LIVING HIGHER He also said the cost of living is about 12 per cent higher than in the Maritimes, "the burden of taxation is approximately 25 per cent greater per capita" and "35 per cent of the homes are overcrowded compared with 19.3 in the Maritimes." Newfoundland's infant death rate was higher and although vast strides had been made in recent years, the tuberculosis death rate was about 2 1/2 times above the mainland average. For every 1,000 babies born alive in 1955, 42 died compared with 30 in Nova Scotia, 37 in New Brunswick, 54 in Prince Edward

Largest Robbery On Continent

MONTREAL (CP)—The Gazette says a Jan. 14 bank robbery in suburban Outremont was "probably the largest ever committed on the North American continent." It says estimates of the loot now run up to \$3,000,000 in cash and securities, "but the only people who know are the thieves and they have not been apprehended." The disappearance of Roman-born Larry Petrov has been linked by police with the robbery. He is believed to have murdered and dismembered. Petrov, 36, has been missing since July 2. He was awaiting trial on a narcotics charge and was also wanted by police for questioning about the robbery. A man's leg found in Lac Beauport in the Laurentian Mountains is believed to have been Petrov's. SAFETY DEPOSITS RIFLED Early estimates placed loot from the robbery in the Outremont branch of the Bank of Montreal at between \$300,000 and \$1,000,000. The Gazette says these figures "have been termed conservative in the light of additional information garnered by police in their search for Petrov."

Students Hunt Indian Relics

MIDLAND, Ont. (CP) — In an old Huron Indian village near this town, 22 miles northwest of Orillia, students of the University of Western Ontario's summer school of Indian archaeology have unearthed one of the largest finds of copper artifacts known in Ontario. The students found eight knives, two awls, a medallion, beads, various "cuttings" and four strips of copper apparently ready to be worked. No copper artifacts have been found before in the place, known as Forget Site. Prof. Wilfrid Jury, under whose direction the students work, said the relics appear to be of the so-called "copper-culture" Indians who lived in the Minnesota area hundreds of years before the Huron Indian era of Ontario. Speculation places the age of the artifacts as high as 5,000 years, but the Forget Site is known to date back only about 1,000 years. However, Prof. Jury said the copper is not of European origin. Two theories are advanced for their presence in the area. One is that migrating Indians from the south brought the items here and traded them to the Hurons. Another theory is that the method of making artifacts was handed down through generations. The Huron Indians somehow may have obtained the copper from the south and fashioned them here.

Sky Inspection Of Disarmament

WASHINGTON (Reuters)—Disarmament inspection in the Arctic and Europe as part of a disarmament plan probably will be taken for-ward in proposals regarding the Arctic by State Secretary Dulles visits Canada. Doctors Disagree Over Cigaret-Cancer Findings

By ED SIMON Canadian Press Staff Writer LONDON (CP) — Nervously or stolidly, the smoking Briton is reaching for another pack as he weighs the possibility that every puff is shortening his life. The stunned silence that greeted the British Medical Research Council's report on the causative effects of cigarette smoking on lung cancer has been followed by a sober period of appraisal. The smoker appears to be making no snap decisions. Cigarette sales have been virtually unaffected by the June 28 cancer report. The MRC's figures themselves were viewed with some suspicion, even by some doctors. "Statistics are notoriously susceptible to the vagaries of the statistician," complains Sir Walter Fergusson Hanay, a Harley Street physician, in a letter to The Times. Sir Walter argues that while it is obvious that heavy smoking is injurious to health, the research upon which the MRC report is based was of insufficient scope to establish the relationship between smoking and lung cancer. Other doctors have advanced the view that the coincidence of heavy smoking and lung cancer does not brand the cigaret as a killer at all. They see both smoking and cancer as symptoms of the real cause — the stress of modern living. One of the proponents of this theory is Sir Henage Ogilvie, a Harley Street surgeon, who writes in the medical journal, Lancet, that cancer, like stomach ulcers, high blood pressure and rheumatoid arthritis, commonly develops among people who live in a state of nervous tension. Heavy smoking by such people, he says, is simply an attempt to relieve the tension. The tension itself is the real culprit. Sir Henage notes frequent intervals where the first attack of cancer has followed a bereavement, the breakup of a relationship, a financial crisis or an accident. Observing such cases, he gradually concluded that "the happy man never gets cancer." Some sceptics of a less scientific turn of mind have been won over to the MRC's way of thinking. One recent convert gave this explanation: "The government is starving for tax money. If it is ready to risk thousands of pounds in tobacco revenue by publishing those figures, there must be something to them."
